AG affirms that a Republican, **Constitutional reform looming**

Antigua and Barbuda will make concrete steps on the road to further political development when the government initiates public discussions on two critical issues; Republican status and Constitutional reform.

Attorney General, Steadroy Benjamin, spoke to theses initiatives during a lively presentation on the 2023 National Budget in the House of Representatives on Tuesday.

"Our status in Antigua and Barbuda today is that we are a Constitutional Monarchy; Parliament is made of up the Senate, the House of Representatives, and the Governor General, representing the Crown. We have to become a Republic in this country. I am asking all persons in the state to think about it. If we become a Republic is that not the natural gradual thing to do?" he asked.

Benjamin said he has already dispatched to the Opposition Leader, several articles and publications on the issue and has encouraged him to familiarize

himself with the subject. "In every democracy, there are three arms of government; the legislature (parliament) the executive (the cabinet) and the judiciary (the court system), and if we don't control those three organs, we are not really free," he declared.

The attorney general called on the members on the opposition bench to 'put politics aside' and give full support to efforts to attain Republican status for Antigua and Barbuda.

He also indicated that he firmly believes that the country should not stop

there, but make the necessary move to have the Caribbean Court of Justice as the final court of appeal as part of constitutional reform.

"I come to another topic; Constitutional Reform, we must talk about that. It is not a new thing. In 1994 the late Cosmos Phillip wrote an article on the subject. A committee was set up that produced a booklet. There is much discussion about constitutional reform. Among the subject is, whether men of religion should be elected to the House. These are matters we will have to look at when the prime minister announces his decision sometime in the future," he stated.


Another issue, he suggested, is whether or not the country should remain a bicameral system with two houses of parliament. He noted that the Commonwealth of Dominica currently has only one chamber. That too is a matter for further discussion, according to the attorney general.

Debate on National Budget **2023 ends**

The debate on the National Budget 2023 came to an end last evening in the House of Representatives, following four full days of presentations from members from both the government and opposition benches.

Prime Minister Gaston Browne brought the debate to a close by complementing his colleagues for the level of the debate they presented to parliament, as well as addressing some of the issues raised by the opposition members.

In response to calls for national unity, the prime minister said that this could only

He noted that there has been a smear campaign

waged against members of veyor. the government with several outlandish lies including one which claimed that he was wanted by the FBI of the United States and that he had brought into the country US\$4.5 billion in cash. According to the prime minister, he was particularly amazed when, even otherwise intelligent people, believed this lie.

PM Browne stated that it was a dangerous game to traffic in untruth, mis-information and dis-information. noting that it could have a boomerang effect; that is coming back to harm the pur-

Such tactics, he continued, will only harm the image of the country and lower its standards in the eyes of the world.

At the end of his presentation, the opposition sought to make a case of whether or not Sir Robin Yearwood had signed the register as a member of the House.

The debate extended for some time, but it was eventually resolved when the attorney general advised that Yearwood had in fact signed once, and was informed that he did not have to sign twice.



"A great injustice done to former PM Baldwin Spencer"

The nomination of former Prime Minister Baldwin Spencer to be the Speaker of the House of Representatives by a member of the House and who at the critical moment did not vote for him was an injustice meted out to the respected, retired


politician

That's the assertion of Attorney General, Steadroy Cutie Benjamin speaking in the House of Representatives on Tuesday, noting that Spencer should not have been used by anyone as a political tool.

"When we stand in the House of Representatives and we make statements and we do things, history will record us, look upon us and determine if what we did was correct. My friend, Sir Robin Yearwood and I are the only two active politicians who are serving today, who were members of parliament in 1981; I was a senator then. My friend, Mr. Baldwin Spencer has served for many years in parliament, including ten as prime minister," he recalled.

Benjamin continued by saying that Spencer has done a lot for the country as an outstanding trade unionist par excellence, as well as a member of parliament. and that those who sought to make a mockery of this outstanding servant of the people have done him an injustice.

"What happened when we came here after the elections at our first meeting? The government submitted its candidate, the opposition did likewise and then some gentleman, an independent

candidate raised the name of Baldwin Spencer and this was seconded by the member for Barbuda. When the votes came, not a single vote was cast for Mr. Spencer. What an absolute disgrace!" he exclaimed.

The attorney general cautioned those involved in this dastardly act to at all times bear in mind that their words and deeds are recorded in the official records of parliament for posterity and that history will judge them for what they did to Spencer; a man who served the nation well and with much honour.

"You have disgraced this man, you have destroyed his reputation and that is something he will never live down," he stated.

Benjamin added that if they wanted to make a point under the Standing Orders, then they ought to have selected someone else and not subject Mr. Spencer to public ridicule and embarrassment.

All beaches in Antigua and Barbuda remain accessible to residents

The beaches in Antigua and Barbuda remain accessible to all citizens and residents.

That's the comment coming from Minister for Housing, Land, Works and Urban Renewal, the Hon. Maria Browne in responding to social media discussions on access to a number of beaches in Antigua and Barbuda where development is taking place.

Social media discussions suggest that persons are being blocked from entering and using beaches where development is taking place with some being granted access with limitations.

Referencing the Physical Planning Act, 2003 Section 50 (1) (2) (3) (4) and (5), Minister Marie Browne says that no owner, developer or occupier of land leading to a beach has the authority to prevent persons from accessing and using the beaches on Antigua and Barbuda.

The Act in Section 50 (1) states: 'There shall be at least one public landward access to and right of way to every beach in Antigua and Barbuda,' while Section 50 (2) addresses the issue of access through private property: 'Where there is no alternative public access, traditional public use of a private landward access through an existing private development shall be sufficient grounds for establish-

ing a public right of way over that access for the purpose of access to the beach by the public.'

The full section on Public Access and Right of Way to Beaches state as follows:

- 50. (1) There shall be at least one public landward access to and right of way to every beach in Antigua and Barbuda.
- (2) Where there is no alternative public access, traditional public use of a private landward access through an existing private development shall be sufficient grounds for establishing a public right of way over that access for the purpose of access to the beach by the public.
- (3) Where the only landward access to a beach is through an existing private development where traditional public use pursuant to subsection (2) of this section has not been established, the Crown may acquire the right to public use of that beach access by gift, negotiation, contract, purchase or lease, compulsory acquisition 'in exchange for other property, interest, or financial exemption, or by such other means as the Minister may recommend, as a condition of issuance of any permit or licence required under 'the provisions of any Act.
- (4) Where land is acquired by way of compulsory acquisition for a beach

access the provisions of the Land Acquisition Act shall apply in respect of such acquisition.

(5) Where a proposed development is likely to adversely affect the public's ability to access a beach from the landward side, any development permit shall require as a condition a landward public access through the development at all times free of charge.

Making reference to the Pearns Point development. which is at the centre of discussions on some social media platforms, Minister Browne stated that there are seven beaches within that development with one main 20-foot public right of way which runs through the private property. She said that currently the Survey and Mapping Department is establishing access boundaries for all seven beaches with official boundary marks and

During this period, Minister Browne asks that users of the beaches at Pearns Point exercise patience and collaborate with the property owners while accessing the beaches.

The Development Control Authority and the Survey and Mapping Department have prepared a preliminary Beach Access Report which governs access and use of all beaches in Antigua and Barbuda. The report is being reviewed for publication.

Industrial action averted at landfill, NSWMA

Industrial action by workers at the Solid Waste National Management Authority (NSWMA) head office and the sanitary landfill at Cooks Waste Disposal facility, was averted after an agreement was reached regarding the payment of

outstanding monies.

President of the Antigua Trades and Labour Union (AT&LU), Wigley George, said the workers had threatened industrial action early Wednesday morning to make known their displeasure over the delays in payment of outstanding monies.

He explained that the amounts represented monies from two contracts, on behalf of the workers at the head office and those at the land fill. Last December, the workers received partial payments for outstanding amounts.

George further explained there is still an amount of eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000.00) outstanding. He said some of these monies were calculated based on the proposed new increases that the government will grant.

The union leader indicated that he took the initiative to get word directly to the Health Minister, Sir Molwyn Joseph who immediately journeyed to the land fill at Cooks to speak to the workers.

During the discussion, both the workers and the minister agreed to a formula for payment of the outstanding amount to the satisfaction of all. Sir Molwyn agreed to take the matter to today's Cabinet meeting to have the agreement endorsed.

Under said agreement, the workers will be paid half the amount by May 1st, 2023, and the other half will be paid some time afterwards.

George said the agreement averted a strike that would have caused disruptions in the collection of garbage in several areas of the island, which would have led to a pile up of garbage, that would have been both unsightly and unhealthy.

He credited the minister for his speedy response to bring an amicable solution to what would have been a messy situation.

Antigua and Barbuda and Serbia agree to abolish visa requirement

Antigua and Barbuda and the Republic of Serbia signed an agreement in Washington DC, on behalf of their governments, abolishing visa requirements for their citizens. This move is seen as strengthening the passport of Antigua and Barbuda, internationally.

The Agreement was negotiated and signed between Ambassador Sir Ronald Sanders, representing Antigua and Barbuda, and Ambassador Marko Djuric on behalf of the Republic of Serbia.

Ambassador Sanders remarked that, "with the signing of the Agreement with Serbia, citizens of Antigua and Barbuda now have visa-free access to more than 162 nations, making the Antigua and Barbuda passport one of the strongest in the world."

He added, that "both tourism and investment in Antigua and Barbuda are enhanced by making access for visitors easier for up to 90 days a year, without a visa."

Ambassador Djuric described the Agreement as "another step in further strengthening the friendship and cooperation between Serbia and Antigua and Barbuda."

Students from Antigua and Barbuda already benefit from scholarships to study in Serbia, and the two countries have pledged to examine ways in which they could be helpful to each other, including through co-operation in tackling global issues, such as the economic consequences of the Russian war on Ukraine.

The two Ambassadors agreed to meet regularly to explore deeper economic cooperation between the two states in the interest of their people.




National Parks Authority successfully completes \$80,000 grant project

The National Parks Authority has successfully completed a US\$80 thousand-dollar grant project, that introduced significant advancements to its ongoing work in the area of marine management in Antigua and Barbuda.

Funding for the Enhancing Marine Ecosystem Management in the Nelson's Dockyard National Park project was negotiated and secured through the Marine Ecosystems and Protected Area Trust (MEPA), which supports the protection, recovery and effective management of protected areas across Antigua and Barbuda.

The three-year project was brought to a formal clo-



sure during an official ceremony in the Antigua Naval Dockyard on Tuesday 7th March. The ceremony was attended by a number of community stakeholders and officials including Governor General's Deputy Sir Clare Roberts.

Through the MEPA funded project, which was activated in 2020, the National Parks was able to undertake a number of wide-ranging initiatives as part of the marine management project.

"The MEPA Trust was basically set up to support environmental initiatives through grant making, project and programme implementation as well as to be a sustainable finance mechanism to support marine protected areas. We are very pleased to have the National Parks Authority as one of our pilot grants," Chief Executive Officer of the MEPA Trust Sasha Middleton told the ceremony.

One of the major successes was the operationalizing of a marine vessel, purchased under a separate project through the International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources (IUCN). The vessel, Acropora, was operationalised under MEPA through the purchase of a Boat Trailer, GPS Equipment, Marine Radio, Safety Equipment and Buoys.

The grant received, from the MEPA Trust, also significantly boosted the research and monitoring activities throughout the expansive marine area of the park.

Other project activities include the collection of Li-DAR data around the park, the introduction of marine biodiversity monitoring activities, conducting stakeholder outreach workshops and the installation of No-Prop zones, which prohibit propeller driven boats from

moving through certain areas of the coastline.

The No-Prop zones at Galleon Beach and Pigeon Point have been created for the protection of the local community and safe vessel operation.

The project has also supported the National Parks Authority in its efforts to increase capacity and equip it with a better understanding of the marine ecosystem in the area.

In this connection, the closing ceremony featured the unveiling of a 3D diorama that showcases the unique vibrance, diversity and interconnectivity of the rich cultural heritage and environmental assets of the National Park. Conceptualized by team members of the National Park, it was built and designed by artists Emile Hill and Leudis Gittens.

"We now have an amazing 3D model of the National Park, where



you can see the ecological resources, the cultural resources and the entire boundaries of the Park. So I wish to thank MEPA and the Caribbean Diversity Fund (CDF) because without their support we wouldn't be able to display this amazing visual of the Park," noted Ruleo Camacho, Marine Ecologist within the Environment Unit of the NPA.

The ongoing data collection work will ultimately help in creating a report on the status of the marine and coastal environment in the National



Park. This process brings Antigua and Barbuda much closer to meeting its commitments.

The National Parks Authority also continues to seek ways to improve its ability to meet its legal mandate of protecting and managing the ecological and natural resources within its boundaries. A Marine Spatial Plan is in the works and will support these overarching goals in making sure the marine resources of the park remain safe and accessible for all stakeholders and members of the community.

Meta lay-offs: Facebook owner to cut 10,000 staff

Meta, which owns Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp, has announced plans to cut 10,000 jobs.

It will be the second wave of mass redundancies from the tech giant, which laid off 11,000 employees last November.

Meta chief executive Mark Zuckerberg said the cuts - part of a "year of efficiency" - would be "tough"

In addition to the 10,000 jobs cut, 5,000 vacancies at the firm will be left unfilled, he told staff.

In a memo, Mr Zuckerberg told employees he believed the company had suffered "a humbling wake-up call" in 2022 when it experienced a dramatic slowdown in revenue.

Meta previously announced that in the three months to December 2022, earnings were down 4% year-on-year - though it still managed to make a profit of more than \$23bn over the course of 2022.

Mr Zuckerberg cited higher interest rates in the US, global geopolitical instability and increased regulation as some of the factors affecting Meta, and contributing to the slowdown.

"I think we should prepare ourselves for the possibility that this new economic reality will continue for many years," he said.

The latest job cuts come as companies, including Google and Amazon, have been grappling with how to balance cost-cutting measures with the need to remain competitive.

At the start of this year, Amazon announced it planned to close more than 18,000 jobs because of "the uncertain economy" and rapid hiring during the pandemic, while Google's parent company Alphabet made 12,000 cuts.

According to layoffs. fyi, which tracks job losses in the tech sector, there have been more than 128,000 job cuts in the tech industry so far in 2023.

Mr Zuckerberg said the recruitment team would be the first to be told whether they were affected by the cuts, and would find out on Wednesday.

He also outlined when other teams would be informed: "We expect to announce restructurings and lay-offs in our tech groups in late April 2023, and then our business groups in late May 2023," he wrote in the memo to staff on Tuesday.

"In a small number of cases, it may take through to the end of the year to complete these changes.

"Our timelines for international teams will also look different, and local leaders will follow up with more details."

Sadly, we're getting used to hearing about big tech lay-offs, as the giants of the sector continue to tighten their belts.

Many like Meta make most of their money from advertising. Now they're faced with a perfect storm: of falling ad revenues from companies with their own bills to pay, and a user base which has less money to spend, making existing ad space less valuable.

It's interesting to note that Meta is looking to its recruitment team in the latest round of cuts.

I often hear that Silicon Valley firms have a tendency to over-recruit, for two reasons. Firstly, so they have staff ready to handle sudden growth, which can happen (just look at TikTok). And, secondly, to retain those people perceived to be "top tech talent", whom they don't want working for their rivals.

Both are luxuries, it seems, that are no longer affordable.

Meta has the added risk of Mark Zuckerberg's enormous gamble on the metaverse being The Next Big Thing. If he's right, his firm will regain its crown, but if he's wrong, the \$15bn+dollars he has spent on it so far could disappear in a puff of mixed reality smoke.

Mr Zuckerberg said there would be no new hires until the restructuring was complete, adding that he aimed to make the company "flatter" by "removing multiple layers of management".

He also dedicated a section of his correspondence to hybrid work. His claims that software engineers who joined Meta in person performed better than those who joined remotely, suggest hybrid working will come under scrutiny during the current "year of efficiency".

Avril Lavigne confronts topless protester onstage while The Weeknd wins big at Juno Awards

Avril Lavigne confronted a topless environmental protester onstage at the Juno Awards, the Canadian equivalent of the Brits.

As the singer introduced a performance at the start of Monday's ceremony, a woman ran onto the stage behind her.

A message on her back read "save the green belt", apparently in reference to a controversial housing development plan by the Ontario government.

Lavigne tried to finish her speech before confronting the woman.

"Get the [expletive] off," she said and swatted at her breast, reported Canada's CBC News. The woman was then escorted off stage by a security guard.

The pop-rocker alluded to the intruder in her later acceptance speech.

"Now, nobody try anything this time. I'll [mess a woman] up," joked Lavigne, while collecting the TikTok Juno fan choice award.

The ceremony's host, Shang-Chi actor Simu Liu praised Lavigne, who is

from Ontario, for "handling that topless lady like a champion".

In November, the Ontario government issued new regulations to remove 7,400 acres of protected Greenbelt land and open it up for housing, with 50,000 new homes set to be built by 2025.

The move, which has been criticised by environmental groups, is under investigation by the province's auditor general and integrity commissioner.

Elsewhere on the night, Toronto singer The Weeknd became the Juno's second most-honoured artist of all time.

The star won album of the year for Dawn FM - a concept record set in purgatory - earning him his 22nd Juno award, overtaking Celine Dion and Bryan Adams.

Only country-pop singer Anne Murray has more, with 24.

The musician, whose real name is Abel Tesfaye, did not attend the event, and his absence reportedly prompted jeers from the crowd at the Rogers Place venue in Edmonton, Alberta.

Meanwhile, rock band Nickelback, whose lead singer Chad Kroeger used to be married to Lavigne, were inducted into the Canadian Music Hall of Fame at the event.

"Twenty seven years, blood sweat and tears, started off 300 kilometres southeast of here in a little town called Hanna," said Kroeger, referencing the band's hometown.

"We had no idea what we were doing and most of the time still don't," he added. "But everything we did wound up leading us to this moment right here. But we didn't make it here without a lot of help."

They then closed the show by performing their hits Rockstar, How You Remind Me and Animals.

St Lucian leads British Airways first flight with all-black crew

British Airways recently made history by operating a flight with an all-Black Crew for the first time ever.

Flight BA 255 departed on February 8, 2023, from London Heathrow Airport to Bridgetown, Barbados, and was led by Sarah Diane Louis, an Inflight Manager from St Lucia.

Sarah shared that she started working with British Airways in 2011 as a cabin crew member before enrolling in the Future Talent Crew (FTC Program), which prepared her for a management position. She shadowed other managers on flights, completed assignments, graduated and then applied for a managerial position. Now, she serves as an inflight manager.

success. Sarah shared her pride in leading the all-Black crew on this historical flight, representing herself and her home country of St Lucia.

"It was a magical day and we worked incredibly well as a team. Our customers were delighted with the exceptional service received from our crew.

"The feedback on social media platforms from our customers and the public has been overwhelming and has gone viral. Thank you to British Airways for giving us the platform to make history.

"When you're a leader operating a historic flight, the pressure is on you to ensure that you support your crew and empower them to make an impact as all eyes are on you. As a little girl

growing up, I always dreamt about travelling the world and working for British Airways.

"I am honoured and humbled to have been a part of this momentous occasion. This is the importance of representation because it inspires others to be what they can see."

Sarah also spoke about the importance of being one's self, giving advice to aspiring young men and women in the Caribbean to work hard and believe in their dreams.

Grenada calls for peace in St. Lucia as gang violence claims seven lives

Loop - The Government of Grenada has expressed regret over the upsurge in gang violence that is occurring in St Lucia.

Grenada says the gang violence, which has claimed seven lives in the southern town of Vieux Fort since last Thursday, has caused unnecessary loss of life and emotional distress to families and communities and has also disrupted the education of children and business activity in affected areas. Prime Minister, Dickon Mitchell, who is the Chairman of the Regional Security System (RSS), has responded favourably to a request from Saint Lucia's Prime Minister, Philip Pierre, for the RSS to support the Royal

Prime Minister, Dickon Police Force of Saint Lucia.

Personnel from the RSS are expected to arrive in Saint Lucia from this week.

"The Caribbean region is proudly a zone of peace – a designation that we cannot take for granted, especially given current global tensions," Mitchell said.

"Our small, and often close-knit, communities have no place for this level of violence, which threatens the lives and livelihoods of our citizens, and places our tourism-dependent economies at risk. We call on all parties to work with the relevant authorities towards a peaceful solution."

Grenada said it will stand with the people of St Lucia in their fight against criminals.

Barbados denies social media reports on pending Computer Misuse Bill

CMC - Attorney General and Minister of Legal Affairs, Dale Marshall, Monday described as "unadulterated garbage" social media reports that the government intends to pass a law which will make it an offence, among other things, to record a fight, or to record the police, or to record someone without their permission.

Marshall said that he had read "with some dismay", a statement which has been circulated widely on social media, purporting to set out what is going to be enacted in what is referred to as a "Computer Misuse Bill".

"Unfortunately, Barbadians at home and abroad have taken what they have read as being accurate and have assumed that it is from a legitimate or knowledgeable source, and it has generated a significant amount of comment.

"That statement alleges that the Government intends to pass a law which will



make it an offence, among other things, to record a fight, or to record the police, or to record someone without their permission," Marshall said.

He said that the statement goes on to state persons must seek the permission of a Government Minister to record or post projects and that you also need the permission of Government Information Service to post things on social media. It suggests that to even record oneself will be an offence.

"Let me call that what it is – unadulterated garbage. It is mischief that has taken on a life of its own," Marshall said, adding "we are bringing a new Cybercrime statute which will repeal the now outdated and inadequate Computer Misuse Act.

"It will deal with a whole set of offences which are not now covered by the existing legislation – such as cyber-bullying, grooming children using computers, child pornography, revenge porn, cyber forgery, and fraud. It was researched and worked on by the Law Reform Commission, which is chaired by Sir David Simmons."

Marshall said that the Law Reform Commission has prepared a draft Bill, which now has to be considered by Cabinet and, if acceptable, will form the basis of further drafting by the Chief Parliamentary Counsel.

"I have seen and read the draft Bill, and I assure Barbadians that none of the things set out in that mischievous statement that is being circulated is in the draft Cybercrime Bill, or is in the contemplation of the Government.

"What is being circulated is certainly not in keeping with any policies of the Government," the Attorney General added.

"There are all kinds of suggestion about the unsafe nature of the place," he said.

Hercules vanished while operating the bulldozer during the early hours of Saturday and the residents of Linden, Region 10 picketed the office of bauxite mining company, calling for a complete halt to operations until the missing employee is located.

Hercules had been employed as an operator with the company for the last 40 years, and media reports said Hercules was set to retire later this year.

US drone crashes after encounter with Russian jet

BBC - A Russian fighter jet has collided with a US drone, causing the unmanned US aircraft to crash into the Black Sea, the American military says.

The incident highlights the increasing risk of direct confrontation between Russia and the US over the Ukraine war.

The US says the drone was on a routine mission in international airspace when two Russian jets tried to intercept it.

Russia said the drone crashed after a "sharp manoeuvre", and denied that the two aircraft made direct contact.

The Russian defence ministry also said the MQ-9 Reaper drone was flying with its transponders turned off. Transponders are communications devices that allow the aircraft to be tracked.

Reaper drones are surveillance aircraft with a 20m (66ft) wingspan.

The incident happened at about 07:03 Central European Time (06:03 GMT) on Tuesday, according to the US military.

"Our MQ-9 aircraft was conducting routine operations in international airspace when it was intercepted and hit by a Russian aircraft, resulting in a

crash and complete loss of the MQ-9," the statement said.

Several times before the collision the Su-27 fighter jets dumped fuel on the drone in a "reckless, environmentally unsound and unprofessional manner", it said.

The US summoned the Russian ambassador in Washington, Anatoly Antonov, to protest against the move. Following the meeting, Russian state media quoted Antonov as saying that Moscow saw the drone incident as "a provocation".

Tensions have risen over the Black Sea ever since Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014.

Since Russia's full-

scale invasion of Ukraine the US and the UK have stepped up reconnaissance and surveillance flights, though always operating in international airspace.

The key question is whether Tuesday's encounter was an attempt by Russia to disrupt the US drone and its work, or whether it was a deliberate attempt to bring it down.

According to the US, there has been a "pattern of dangerous actions by Russian pilots" interacting with allied aircraft in the region.

So this could simply have been a mistake by a Russian pilot who got too close as they "buzzed" the drone. But if this was a deliberate attack on a US aircraft by a Russian warplane, then that would amount to a huge provocation and a substantial escalation.

In that case, the attack would be seen as an attempt by the Kremlin to test the response of the United States.

Western allies have worked hard to stop the war in Ukraine escalating into a direct confrontation with Russia. But this incident over the Black Sea is just that. The US will now have to evaluate its response.

As US military commanders warned in their statement, this was a dangerous act that "could lead to miscalculation and unintended escalation".



Andrew Tate: Romanian court rejects bail application

BBC - A Romanian court has rejected the latest application for bail by Andrew Tate.

The controversial British social media influencer and his brother Tristan have been detained since Decem-

They are being investigated on charges of rape, people trafficking forming an organised crime group. Both have denied wrongdoing.

Mr Tate's spokeswoman said the ruling was "disappointing" and that his legal team would appeal.

Lawyers for Mr Tate have long argued that keeping him in preventative custody is unnecessarily harsh, when other judicial options - such as house arrest - are available.

Judges have so far disagreed, based on the perceived risk of Mr Tate fleeing the country, influencing witnesses or evidence, or

that his release would disturb public order.

The request for bail in place of custody was new, but the response from the court, the same.

In late February, the court ruled that Mr Tate should remain in custody until 29 March.

Wednesday, Tate's brother Tristan will also apply for bail in a separate hearing.

Last month, an appeals court overturned all but one of the justifications for keeping Tristan Tate in detention.

No charges have yet

been brought against the brothers or the two Romanian associates who were arrested alongside them.

In 2016, Mr Tate, a former kickboxer, was removed from British TV show Big Brother over a video which appeared to show him attacking a woman.

He went on to gain notoriety online, with Twitter banning him for saying women should "bear responsibility" for being sexually assaulted. He has since been reinstated.

Despite social media bans he gained popularity, particularly among young men, by promoting what he presented as a hyper-masculine, ultra-luxurious lifestyle.

He blames Mr Sharif for an assassination attempt at a rally in November in which he was wounded in the leg.



"If you look him up, you'll see many impressive statistics about him. Right now with him, he gives me a lot of input. He's very smart and helped me a lot on the water," Tyson said.



His victory in Santa Marta also secured his qualification into next year's Pan American Games in Santiago, Chile, from 20th October to 5th November, 2023.

Tyson said the Pan Am Games in Chile is one of two major events in which he will be competing to secure qualification for the 2024 Summer Olympics in France.

Tyson will take part in his first

competition for this year when he participates at an event in Palma, Spain, today Wednesday, 15th March.

Therefore, in order to give himself the best chance of succeeding, Tyson said he is also seeking financial assistance to facilitate his travels to compete as well as to purchase equipment.

"In 2023, my aim of the year is to just qualify for the Olympic Games. I have two chances to qualify, one in August and one in October. So I am going to be travelling a lot, I need a coach a lot and I need to buy new equipment," Tyson said.

"I am always on the best gear when I am racing because I have to give myself the best opportunity to qualify.
