PAGE 2 Local News Suspect in Custody

A suspect is in custody assisting the police with their investigations into the shooting death of 25-year old businessman, Roudi Shamarli.

On Monday afternoon Roudi Shamarli, was reportedly shot and killed during a brazen daylight armed robbery on DeSouza Road.

According to reports, a lone gunman entered the Pick n Mix Mart and held up the female attendant at gunpoint, and robbed the establishment of an undisclosed sum of money. The victim, who operates the adjacent establishment, Chicken Hub, apparently heard the commotion and went into the superette to investigate, when upon entry he was allegedly shot in the head at close range. The injured man was transported to the Sir Lester Bird Medical Center by the Emergency Medical Services. He was pronounced dead around 1:35 pm by a medical doctor.

The assailant fled the scene on foot.

Pointe Xpress newspaper has been reliably informed

that the police have a suspect in custody. The man was



picked up by the police hours after the incident. No further information was readily available.

The police have issued a statement saying that they are continuing to probe the deadly shooting incident that resulted in the death of Shamarli.

The police also wish to reassure the public that they will continue intensifying their crime-fighting measures to ensure the safety and security of all.

Shamarli has been described as a well-liked individual, known for his simplicity. He is said to have dedicated himself to work diligently and steered clear of trouble. His sole focus was said to be earning and sending money back to his fiancé and the anticipation of their impending marriage consumed him, as he worked tirelessly towards that goal.

Shamarli's killing is the first recorded homicide for 2023.

Antigua and Barbuda supports Saudi Arabia

Antigua and Barbuda has been suggested to a team from Saudi Arabia as an 'excellent' place to invest, as that Kingdom seeks to expand its footprint globally.

The offer was made on Monday by Prime Minister Gaston Browne during a brief meeting with the Chairman of the Saudi Fund for Development and Minister of Tourism of Saudi Arabia, Ahmed Al Khateeb, who led a delegation on an official visit to Antigua and Barbuda for high-level discussions with the government.

"We seek to attract investment from Saudi Arabia knowing that we offer your businessmen and women the opportunity to invest in a stable country. A country whose economy has been growing in a very robust way over the last decade and which would provide stable returns for people," he highlighted.

Additionally, PM Browne spoke of the possibilities for joint investments

with the Saudis on a governmental basis. He said there are many areas for possible cooperation between the two countries and these are some of the areas that he would wish the two delegations to discuss further.

"We hope that from our discussions we would be able to take our relation-



ship to the next level of cooperation," he urged.

The Prime Minister also indicated that he held discussions previously with a delegation from Saudi Arabia, during which he invited the Kingdom to establish an embassy here, adding that the government would be willing to offer the land upon which that embassy would be built. "This is to enable Saudi Arabia to have a physical presence here in the Caribbean and we hope that you would give serious consideration to the offer," he added.

He said Antigua and Barbuda is not only committed to strengthening ties with the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, but it wants to serve as a conduit for deeper ties between the Kingdom and the rest of the Caribbean.

On the question of Saudi Arabia's bid to host Expo 2030, the prime minister assured the delegation that the Kingdom has Antigua and Barbuda's full support. "Other friends have approached us, but we indicated to all that our support for Saudi Arabia is unshakeable," PM Brown declared. Beyond Expo 2030, the prime minister told the Saudi delegation that they can count on Antigua and Barbuda's support on other international issues such as climate change and other environmental issues.

Saudi Arabia committed to closer ties with Antigua and Barbuda

The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia wants to deepen its relationship with Antigua and Barbuda.

To this end, a high-level team representing the Saudi Development Fund paid a courtesy call on Prime Minister Gaston Browne and a delegation comprising several members of the Cabinet.

The delegation is led by the Chairman of the Saudi Fund for Development and the Minister of Tourism of Saudi Arabia (Head of the Delegation) Ahmed Al-Khateeb. Other officials including Deputy Minister of Tourism for International Affairs Sultan Almusallam, Deputy CEO of the Saudi Fund for Development, Faisal Alkahtani, Portfolio Manager/Expo 2030 Team, Mahammadi Shenqiti along with representatives from the Saudi Embassy in Caracas, Venezuela, accompanied the Chairman.

"I want to assure you that we are open to any other construction projects as part of our commitment to the relationship. We value your commitment and support for Saudi Arabia hosting Expo 2030 and we promise you we can meet at the Antigua and Barbuda Pavilion at the Expo," he remarked.

Already, one hundred and thirty-nine countries out of the 170 have pledged support for the Saudi bid, including most of Africa and the Caribbean, along with Central America and countries such as the United States and Canada.

Caribbean health disaster coordinators meet in Antigua


Health disaster coordinators from across the Caribbean are meeting in St. John's this week to sharpen their ability to respond to a future health disaster such as the recent COVID-19 pandemic.

The Ministry of Health, Wellness, Social Transformation and the Environment will be hosting the Caribbean Health Disaster Coordinators Meeting from May 22nd to May 24th, 2023, at the Sandals Grande Resort.

Coming out of the experiences of the COVID-19 pandemic, the health disaster coordinators want to ensure that any future health disaster would generate a different response based on the lessons learned from the pandemic.

"The meeting is being sponsored by the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) with assistance from USAID. This meeting will bring together health disaster coordinators from Antigua and Barbuda and the rest of the region to discuss issues related to disaster management.

"The participants will review past experiences with health emergencies and will create strategies to respond should another occur, particularly in the post-COVID era," a spokesperson for the Ministry of Health stated.



Technology Meta: Facebook owner fined €1.2bn for mishandling data

Facebook's owner, Meta, has been fined €1.2bn (£1bn) for mishandling people's data when transferring it between Europe and the United States.

Issued by Ireland's Data Protection Commission (DPC), it is the largest fine imposed under the EU's General Data Protection Regulation privacy law.

GDPR sets out rules companies must follow to transfer user data outside of the EU.

Meta says it will appeal against the "unjustified and unnecessary" ruling.

At the crux of this decision is the use of standard contractual clauses (SCCs) to move European Union data to the US.

These legal contracts, prepared by the European Commission, contain safeguards to ensure personal data continues to be protected when transferred outside Europe.

But there are concerns these data flows still expose Europeans to the US's weaker privacy laws - and US intelligence could access the data.

This decision does not affect Facebook in the UK. The Information Commissioner's Office told the BBC that the decision "does not apply in the UK"

but said it had "noted the decision and will review the details in due course".

'Dangerous precedent'

Most large companies have complex webs of data transfers - which can include email addresses, phone numbers and financial information - to overseas recipients, many of which depend on SCCs.

And Meta says their broad use makes the fine unfair.

Facebook president Nick Clegg said: "We are therefore disappointed to have been singled out when using the same legal mechanism as thousands of other companies looking to provide services in Europe.

"This decision is flawed, unjustified and sets a dangerous precedent for the countless other companies transferring data between the EU and US."

But privacy groups have welcomed that precedent.

Caitlin Fennessy, of the International Association of Privacy Professionals, said: "The size of this record-breaking fine is matched by the significance of the signal it sends.

"Today's decision signals that companies have a whole lot of risk on the table."

It could make EU companies demand US partners stored data within Europe - or switch to domestic alternatives, she added.

In 2013, former US National Security Agencontractor Edward cy Snowden disclosed American authorities had repeatedly accessed people's information via technology companies such as Facebook and Google.

And Austrian privacy campaigner Max Schrems filed a legal challenge against Facebook for failing to protect his privacy rights, setting off a decade-long battle over the legality of moving EU data to the US.

Europe's highest court, the European Court of Justice (ECJ), has repeatedly said Washington has insufficient checks in place to protect Europeans' information.

And in 2020, the ECJ, ruled an EU-to-US data transfer agreement invalid.

But the ECJ left the door open for companies to use SCCs, saying the transfer of data to any other third country was valid as long as it ensured an "adequate level of data cont'd on pg 11

The Republic of Ireland is set to introduce health warning labels on alcohol products.

Stephen Donnelly, the Irish minister for health, signed new regulations into law on Monday but they will not come into force until 2026.

Labelling will warn consumers about the risks of drinking alcohol as well as providing a product's calorie content and the number of grams of alcohol.

The Irish government said the regulations would bring alcohol products into line with requirements for food packaging.

Mr Donnelly said: "I welcome that we are the first country in the world to take this step and introduce comprehensive health labelling of alcohol products.

Asked about the €1.2bn fine, Mr Schrems said he was "happy to see this decision after 10 years of litigation" but it could have been much higher.

"Unless US surveillance laws get fixed, Meta will have to fundamentally restructure its systems," he added.

Despite the record-breaking size of the fine, experts have said they think Meta's privacy practices will not change.

many more billions by parking illegally," Johnny Ryan, a senior fellow at the Irish Council for Civil Liberties.

The US recently updated its internal legal protections to give the EU greater assurances American intelligence agencies would follow new rules governing such data access.

In 2021, Amazon was fined for similarly flouting the EUss privacy standard.

Ireland's DPC has also fined WhatsApp, another Meta-owned business, for breaching stringent regulations relating to the transparency of data shared with its other subsidiaries.

She said: "This measure goes some way to ensuring consumers are informed about some of the risks from alcohol."



Entertainment 'Fast X' speeds to No. 1; knocks 'Guardians 3' to second

The 10th installment of the "Fast and Furious" franchise was off to the races this weekend, knocking "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3" out of first place and easily claiming the No. 1 spot at the box office. "Fast X" earned \$67.5 million in ticket sales from 4.046 North American theatres, according to estimates from Universal Pictures on Sundav.

It's on the lower end of openings for the series which peaked with "Furious 7's" \$142.2 million launch, the sole movie in the series to surpass \$100 million out of the gates. "Fast X's" domestic debut only ranks above the first three. The last movie, "F9," opened to \$70 million in 2021.

But this is also a series that has usually made the bulk of its money internationally, often over 70 per cent. True to form, overseas it's on turbo drive. "Fast X" opened in 84 markets internationally, playing in over 24,000 theaters, where it earned an estimated \$251.4 million. The top market was China with \$78.3 million, followed by Mexico with \$16.7 million. And it adds up to a \$319 million global debut - the third biggest of the franchise.

"It's a global franchise with a very broad audience," said Jim Orr, Universal's head of domestic distribu-

across the world."

Directed by Louis Leterrier (who took over from Justin Lin during production), "Fast X" brings back the familiar crew including Vin Diesel, Michelle Rodriguez, Tyrese Gibson and Jordana Brewster and adds several newcomers, like Brie Larson, Rita Moreno and a villain played by Jason Momoa. The ever-expanding cast also includes Jason Statham, Charlize Theron, Scott Eastwood and Helen Mirren.

Reports say the movie cost \$340 million to produce, not including marketing.

Reviews were mixed for "Fast X," the begin-

tion. "The themes resonate ning of the end for the \$6 billion franchise, which currently has a 54 per cent on Rotten Tomatoes. AP's Mark Kennedy wrote in his review that, "It has become almost camp, as if it breathed in too much of its own fumes" and that it's also "monstrously silly and stupidly entertaining."

" Book Club: The Next Chapter " added \$3 million in its second weekend to take fourth place, while "Evil Dead Rise" rounded out the top five in its fifth weekend with \$2.4 million.

The Guyana Fire Service has confirmed that the fire which claimed 19 lives at the Mahdia Secondary School female dormitory and left others injured, was maliciously set.

At a media conference, it was revealed that the point of origin was identified to the southwestern end of the building. The scene was handed over to the police.

The building in which the children stayed was described as a concrete and wooden structure with five doors and grilled windows. At the time of the fire, it was reported 56 children were at the dorm.

President of Guyana Dr Irfaan Ali at the news briefing announced three days of official national mourning and as of 4 pm for all flags to be flown at half-mast in honour of these children.

He described today as one of the saddest days in his life as president. He said Guyana is in pain.

The Government of Grenada is examining the idea of installing night-landing facilities as part of a plan for improving the overall operations and structure of the Lauriston Airport.

A team from the Grenada Airports Authority, led by Project Manager of the Caribbean Air Transport Regional Connectivity Project (CATCOP), Don'el Mitchell, were recently on island reviewing the structures that are in place at Lauriston.

He explained that the aim of the project is to enhance regional connectivity by improving the safety of air transport and the resil-



Lauriston airport, Carriacou. ience of airport infrastructure to natural disasters.

Mitchell said that specifically for Carriacou, his team is looking at ways to improve air traffic to the 13 square-mile-island, with discussions on the implementation of facilities for night landing.

Consultant Heinz Wipf, a Air Navigation Consultant from Switzerland, is also in Carriacou as part of Caribbean Air Transport Regional Connectivity Project.

Wipf, who has more than 30 years of experience in the field, is helping to gather data to guide the project's implementation.

For Minister for Carriacou and Petite Martinique Affairs and Local Government, Tevin Andrews, the visit of the Grenada Airports Authority team and the consultant inches the island closer to the implementation of the night-landing facilities, which he listed as one of the major projects for 2023.

He said this should encourage an increase in the tourism market and the attraction of a major hotel brand here for the first time.

Two weeks after resigning from the Dr Keith Mitchell opposition-led New National Party (NNP), Member of Parliament for St Andrew North West, Delma Thomas officially announced her decision to join the ruling National Democratic Congress (NDC).

She made the announcement during a media engagement on Sunday where Prime Minister Dickon Mitchell was present.

The prime minister who is the political leader of the NDC said it is his honour to 'welcome our courageous sister as we embark on this journey towards a stronger and more united Grenada.'

He added: "To the residents of St Andrew North-West, you are blessed with two powerful examples of female leadership. May we all be guided by their example, finding ways to work together to build our country."

Thomas resigned from the NNP on May 7, 2023, stating that her continuation as a member of the party had become untenable following my many attempts to promote the democratisation of the organisation, and the consequent orchestrated backlash from an extremely small section of the party's leadership.

At Sunday's meeting, Thomas who was thinking

of representing her constituents, as an Independent, instead said a resounding yes to join the government's side.

"I say to the prime minister, I say yes. I say yes to work for the people of Grenada, Carriacou and Petite Martinique. I am committed to the people of St Andrew North West. It has always been about you." She has pledged to work with the NDC.

Noting that her political career began in 2008, Thomas said from young, she was raised with integrity and good spiritual values, traits that stayed throughout her life.

Revealing that she has been going through stress since September 2022 to April 13, 2023, Thomas said she will not allow her character to be tainted or her family's.

"There's no one at present in the NNP that can say I have accepted anything from anyone, no one, no one can call my name in on, they could dig as deep as they want. There is nothing."

She said they used to call her the conscience of the party and the government, 'but a difference of opinion will cause you to be on the other side ... will cause you to be viciously attacked.'

Thomas said: "There is a faceless monster, a giant, that came into the office of government and was promised to be one of the most powerful women in Grenada.

And she was indeed powerful for a period. She was making decisions behind the scenes. That faceless monster is still behind the scenes.

This powerful woman has group chats telling them how to attack and when to come after me."

Thomas said despite the character assassinations and online attacks made against her, her character remains untainted.

G20: India hosts tourism meet in Kashmir amid tight security

BBC - India is holding a key G20 tourism meeting in Kashmir amid heightened security and opposition from China.

The working group meeting is being held in Srinagar, the summer capital of the federally administrated territory, from Monday to Wednesday.

This is the biggest international event organised in the region since India scrapped its special status in 2019.

Over 60 delegates from G20 member countries are expected to attend the event.

China, however, has said it will not attend, citing its firm opposition "to holding any kind of G20 meetings in disputed territory". The BBC has emailed India's foreign ministry for its response to China's statement.

Both India and Pakistan claim Kashmir in full, but control only parts of it. The nuclear-armed neighbours have already fought two wars and a limited conflict over the region.

In April, Pakistan, which is not a G20 member, had criticised India's decision to hold the meetings in Kashmir, calling it an "irresponsible" move.

India, however said, that it was "natural" to hold G20 events and meetings in "Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, which are an inte-

gral and inalienable part" of the country.

In 2019, the Bharatiya Janata Party-led federal government had divided the Muslim-majority state of Jammu and Kashmir to create two federally administrated territories - Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. Ladakh is a disputed frontier region along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) between India and China, and both countries claim parts of it.

The Indian government and several sections of the media have calling the G20 event in Kashmir "historic", billing it as an opportunity to showcase the region's culture.

In the days leading up to the event, India had conducted several security drills in Kashmir. The region has seen an armed insurgency against India since 1989 - India accuses Pakistan of fomenting the unrest by backing separatist militants, a charge denied by Islamabad.

Over the decades, opposition politicians, activists and locals have also accused successive Indian governments of human rights violations and stifling of freedoms in the restive region - which Delhi has denied.

This year, the region has witnessed increased attacks by suspected militants and security officers have told the media that they are taking steps to prevent any threats designed to derail the G20 meet.

Elite security forces - including marine commandos, National Security Guards, Border Security Force and police forces - have been deployed in Kashmir to provide ground-to-air security cover, according to reports.

Security has also been boosted around the Dal Lake and the Sher-e-Kashmir International Convention Centre (SKICC) in Srinagar, which is the venue for the meeting.

Schools around the routes that G20 delegates will use have been closed. Military bunkers, a common sight in Kashmir, have been covered with G20 banners to hide them from view.

Grandad's grenade kills US man and injures teens

An Indiana man was killed and his two children injured after a hand grenade found in a grandfather's belongings exploded, say police.

The blast happened on Saturday evening in Lake of the Four Seasons, a community about 140 miles (225km) north-west of Indianapolis.

Police believe someone pulled the pin on the de-vice.

The father died and his 14-year-old son and 18-year-old daughter suffered shrapnel wounds.

Both teenagers were taken to hospital. Their condition was unclear.

In a statement posted to Facebook, the Lake County Sheriff's Department said that responding offi-

The G20, which includes the world's 19 wealthiest nations plus the European Union, accounts for 85% of global economic output and two-thirds of its population.

India currently holds the presidency - which rotates annually between members - and is set to host the G20 summit in Delhi in September.

Palestinian gunmen among three killed in Israeli Nablus raid

Three Palestinians have been shot dead and several wounded by Israeli forces in Nablus, in the occupied West Bank.

Witnesses described hearing gunfire and explosions as Israeli troops raided several houses in the crowded Balata refugee camp, in what they said was the biggest operation there in years.

The Israeli military says gunmen shot at its soldiers, who returned fire.

It says the soldiers found three M16 rifles, ammunition and an explosives workshop. Three arrests were made.

Israeli-Palestinian violence has been intensifying for months with near-nightly Israeli military raids in the West Bank and rising settler violence as well as a series of deadly attacks by Palestinians on Israelis.

Funerals have taken place for the three men who were killed during the latest raid in Nablus. Two have been identified as fighters from the al-Aqsa Martyrs' Brigades, the armed wing of Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas's Fatah faction.

Palestinian sources say these two men were killed in an exchange of fire with Israeli forces, while it was unclear if the third man had joined in the fighting.



The Palestinian presidency condemned what it called the "continuous aggression" against those living in Nablus.

Security camera footage being shared on social media, which cannot immediately be independently verified by the BBC, appears to show that one man was unarmed when shot while approaching a soldier.

Palestinian reports said that Israeli troops entered Balata camp accompanied by bulldozers and that they blocked ambulances from entering.

"All night we didn't sleep, we stayed awake, we were afraid, in horror," a resident of the camp, Um Abdullah, told al-Quds TV.


"We were sitting inside the house and a friend of my son called to say: 'They're going to demolish the house next-door, you need to leave.' Within a few seconds they demolished the house and our windows and doors fell down. We stayed inside and then ran away."

In a statement, the spokesman for the Palestinian presidency, Nabil Abu Rudeineh, condemned what he called "a real massacre and a continuation of the all-out war Israel is waging against the Palestinian people".

He called for the US administration to intervene to put a stop "to the Israeli madness that will drag the region towards an explosion". Overnight, the Israeli military says it made more than a dozen arrests across the West Bank, including three in Jenin. Like Nablus, Jenin has recently seen a concentration of Israeli army raids and has been a hotbed for Palestinian militants.

On Sunday, the Israeli military said a soldier was lightly wounded in a car ramming attack in the village of Hawara, close to Nablus. A search for the driver is continuing.

Earlier this month, two Palestinians were killed and others wounded by Israeli army gunfire during another arrest raid in Balata camp.
