# 47-year-old is the country's latest road fatality

Dale Willock of Seaview Farm is the country's latest road fatality. The 47-year-old died Monday afternoon two days after he was involved in a traffic collision on the Sir Sydney Walling's Highway.

Police reports indicate that on Saturday, a driver of a white Honda Fit motor car, A67300 was travelling from West to East on Sir Sydney Walling Highway at what has been reported as a very high speed. It was further reported that he then proceeded to overtake another vehicle, and in the process collided with the vehicle driven by Willock.

The impact forced Willock's car off the road to the Southern side, where it came to a stop. The EMS arrived on the scene and transported both drivers to the Sir Lester Bird Medical Center. Willock was pronounced dead on Monday at 2:35 pm.

The identity of the other driver or his condition were not immediately available.

The police express condolences to his family.

# Cabinet approves the purchase of heavy-duty equipment

The Ministry of Works has received the greenlight from the Cabinet to undertake a drive to purchase a set of heavy-duty equipment as the government gets ready to scale up the road construction and rehabilitation programme.

Making the announcement, Prime Minister Gaston Browne said the equipment purchase will cover the range of heavy-duty equipment that the Works Ministry needs urgently to undertake the road programme.

The move is aimed at

ensuring that the Ministry of Works is fully equipped to undertake the road programme and not to depend almost exclusively on private heavy-duty equipment owners.

"We are buying a whole slew of equipment; everything that the Ministry of Works wants it will be equipped with them. So, you're going to see improvements in the construction of community roads over time. We have made some progress with the main roads, most have been fixed, but




Prime Minister Gaston Browne we know that the All Saints Road is one of those needing repairs and this will be done shortly," he started.

The prime minister also announced that the National Solid Waste Management Authority will also be acquiring its own set of garbage trucks to make for a more efficient garbage collection system in the country.

"We ordered several garbage trucks, three of which are expected to arrive in the country within a matter of weeks and our plan is to purchase ten such garbage trucks. This is not because we want to displace private garbage truck owners but here you have some of these guys who are paid perhaps every other week and are presenting bills totaling \$10-\$15 million dollars and are threatening to withhold their services unless the bills are paid down. If that is the case, then Solid Waste must acquire its own garbage trucks," he declared.

PM Browne noted that one benefit from Solid Waste owning its own equipment will be a more reliable garbage collection system with garbage being collected twice weekly rather than once weekly as is the current system.

# CBH intensifies inspection of food vendors ahead of major holidays

The Central Board of Health is intensifying its 'rapid inspections' of food vendors scattered across St. John's city.

Over the last weekend, both on Friday night and again on Saturday night, staff from the Public Health Department conducted several rapid inspections in St. John's City. Focus was placed on the possession of a food handlers ID, the presence of a hand washing station, and time and temperature abuse of food. There were many food safety infractions which led to the discontinuation of food for sale to the public.

"On Friday 26th April, a total of seventeen (17) vendors were inspected, ten (10) vendors were instructed to cease the preparation and

sale of food, seven (7) vendors were operating without a hand washing station, while ten (10) vendors were without a valid food safety badge. Six (6) vendors held

food at incorrect temperature, and food items were seized and disposed of from one (1) vendor.," according to a media statement from the CBH.

The exercise was repeated on Saturday, where a total of seven (7) vendors were inspected, four (4) vendors were instructed to cease the preparation and sale of food, three (3) vendors were operating without a hand washing station, while five (5) vendors were without a valid food safety badge. Two (2) vendors held food at incorrect temperature, and food items were seized and disposed of from two (2) vendor.

A meeting was scheduled Monday at the Central Board of Health office, with the owner of the businesses who were instructed to cease the preparation of food.

The Central Board of Health is appealing to food vendors to obtain a valid food safety badge, and to be in compliant with the recommendations given in order to resume the preparation and sale of food.

In addition, the homes and businesses must be inspected before reopening. There will be a special food safety training on Wednesday 1st May, for those businesses who were instructed to cease the preparation of food for public consumption.

Food Vendors must register no later than Tuesday 30th April, at the Central Board of Health office on Upper Church Street for the food safety training.



### Joy-Marie King named among **Changemakers for 2024**

### Blue Ivy Carter joins mum Beyoncé in Lion King prequel

Beyoncé and Jay-Z's daughter Blue Ivy Carter has joined the voice cast of The Lion King prequel Mufasa: The Lion King.

Blue Ivy, 12, voices Kiara, daughter of King Simba and Queen Nala, played by her mother.

Beyoncé is reprising the role from Jon Favreau's 2019 photorealistic remake of the animated 1994 original.

The new film, directed by Moonlight filmmaker Barry Jenkins, will explore Mufasa's origin story and his childhood with brother Scar.

Like the 2019 movie, it will also combine live-action filmmaking techniques with photoreal computer-generated imagery.

Jenkins told US breakfast show Good Morning America that Blue Ivy was «professional», while Beyoncé was a «mum first» on set.

"They just approached it that they both wanted to perform and do the best they could. And yet, they didn't have to pretend very much because they really are mother and daughter."

The first teaser trailer for the film also aired on the programme.

A voiceover says Mufasa was born "without a drop of nobility in his blood" but "would change our lives forever".

Aaron Pierre and Kelvin Harrison Jr will voice the younger versions of Mufasa and Scar, respectively in the new movie.

The 2019 Lion King film, featured the voices of Donald Glover as Simba, Beyoncé as Nala and Chiwetel Ejiofor as Scar.

Glover will reprise his role in Jenkins's prequel. The cast also includes

Mads Mikkelsen and Thandiwe Newton, with Seth Rogan and Billy Eichner also returning.

The movie will feature original songs by Hamilton creator Lin-Manuel Miranda, who has also penned songs for films including Mary Poppins Returns and Encanto.

While this is Blue Ivy's debut film role, she has performed previously as a dancer on her mum's live tour.

Blue Ivy is the eldest daughter of Beyoncé and Jay-Z. The couple also share twins Rumi and Sir, six.

Her casting will no doubt relight the debate about so-called nepo babies.

The term refers to suggestions of nepotism when a young person follows in their famous parents' footsteps.

Mufasa: The Lion King is due to be released in the UK in December this year.

### Tesla shares jump after reports of China deal

Tesla's shares have jumped after reports the firm has cleared an important regulatory hurdle in China by partnering with search giant Baidu.

The reports come after chief executive Elon Musk made a surprise visit to meet the country's number two leader, Premier Li Qiang.

The deal with Baidu brings Mr Musk a step closer to rolling out Tesla's self-driving technology in China.

Wedbush analyst Daniel Ives said it was "a watershed moment". Tesla has been contacted for comment. Baidu declined to comment.

Mr Ives said the company faces "massive domestic electric vehicle competition in China along with softer demand", but that its "longterm valuation story" depends on it also getting approval for fully autonomous driving.

The agreement with Baidu that is being reported would allow Tesla to go ahead with some autonomous driving technology in China.

Baidu's mapping and navigation services would aid Tesla's self-driving technology, including assisted parking, but full autonomous technology would still require further approval.

Tesla is one of the

world's largest electric car manufacturers, and China is its second biggest market, but it has yet to launch autonomous driving there as it has in other countries, such as the US.

Mr Musk strongly believes that autonomous driving is the future.

"If somebody doesn't believe Tesla is going to solve autonomy, I think they should not be an investor," he has previously said.

However, even in the US, autonomous cars face challenges and further regulatory hurdles.

Tesla's autopilot allows drivers to hand control to the vehicle's AI, but it still needs constant human oversight.

Despite this precaution, misuse of the technology has been fatal.

Last Friday, the US auto regulator opened a probe into the «adequacy» of a software update Tesla made to try to fix problems with its autopilot feature.

The agency said "foreseeable driver misuse of the system played an apparent

role" in at least 13 Tesla crashes, including at least one death, and many more involving serious injuries.

In December, a former Tesla employee told the BBC he did not believe the technology powering the firm>s self-driving vehicles was safe enough to be used on public roads.

Tesla's share price jumped almost 12% as markets opened in the US on Monday and means the stock has recovered some of the value it has lost since the

### Dr. Keith Mitchell raises concerns over government's parliamentary tactics

CMC - Grenada's Opposition Leader Dr Keith Mitchell has accused government of purposefully debating and passing the gun amnesty resolution while he was unavoidably absent.

Speaking to the Caribbean Media Corporation (CMC) on the sidelines of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Cricket Conference on Thursday - the same day the gun amnesty resolution was passed in the lower house, Mitchell said he believes the government deliberately schedules important sittings of the House of Representatives to clash with his personal appointments.

"It seems like, it appears that they do everything possible to ensure that whenever I am scheduled to an activity outside of the country, or having to do something that I can't avoid that they schedule a meeting," the former prime minister said.

He cited a previous occasion when a meeting of the Finance Committee of the parliament, of which he is a member, was held on the day that he had to attend a court outside of Grenada, despite his request to have the meeting rescheduled.

"It was well known that I had a court date that I had to meet, because it was announced publicly. They scheduled the Finance

Committee on the date of my court date. So one could interpret whatever they want from this.

"And we then ask through our representative to adjust it, the prime minister said he is not adjusting. So they went ahead without me, who would have added the level of experience in my years as Minister of Finance and of course prime minister for 23 years."

Speaking about the passage of Thursday's resolution in his absence, Mitchell said "certainly a gun legislation amnesty something like this, you would want someone in my experience and certainly it would be useful for them; and for the country for my presence. You may still pass the bill because you have the majority, but certainly you will give yourself and the country an opportunity to hear from someone like myself with all the years of experience."

Mitchell was also disappointed that he was absent for the passage of the Communication Bill through all its stages.

He said however, the members of the opposition met prior to Thursday's sitting and agreed on areas they will focus on to bring attention to the opposition's concerns regarding the bill.

start of the year, with the price down over a quarter since January.

The Chinese approval — which hasn't been officially confirmed by Tesla or Baidu but was reported by AP, Reuters, Bloomberg, the Financial Times, and others — comes after Mr Musk flew to China on the weekend to meet with senior officials.

State media quoted Mr Musk as saying Tesla wanted co-operation with the country to "achieve more win-win results".

Part of the reason analysts believe the firm needs approval in China is because its financial performance has weakened.

In its results last Tuesday, it recorded \$21.3bn (£17bn) in sales for the first three months of this year.

This was a drop from the \$23.3bn recorded in the first three months of 2023 and lower than analysts' predictions of just over \$22bn.

It pinned its falling sales on "additional competitors" and "changes in government and economic incentives" for electric vehicles.

US revenue decreased from \$11.2bn to \$9.76bn, while Chinese sales fared better, falling from \$4.89bn to \$4.59bn.

# Kenya flooding: Around 50 killed in villages near Mai Mahiu town

About 50 people have died in Kenya in a deluge following heavy rains and flooding, a Red Cross official has said.

People in villages near Mai Mahiu, about 60km (37 miles) from the capital, Nairobi, were swept away as they slept.

Rescue efforts are continuing to pull people out of the mud, with fears that the death toll could rise.

More than 100 people have been killed in floods that have devastated parts of Kenya in the last month.

A wide brown scar of mud, uprooted trees and crushed houses slices through the area of Mai Mahiu.

A roaring sound woke people up in the early hours of Monday as a tide of water crashed down from upriver.

Residents spoke of a night of frantic efforts to pull people out of the raging flood and dig them out of the mud.

Deden Muiri, 60, said he heard the roar and saw lightening flash. But before he had time to think he was up to his neck in water.

He saw the flood take his wife and was swept in the opposite direction.

Convinced he was going to die, Mr Muiri said a quiet goodbye to his family.

Miraculously though, he was able to grab a tree branch and clung to life by hanging on.

One of his daughters knows how to swim, he said, and was able to rescue two of his grandchildren.

When we arrived many people were out surveying the damage, walking along the gauged out riverbank, poking through the debris, trying to come to grips with the catastrophe.

Peter Munyinge's house survived but the rest of his neighbourhood did not.

"There are little babies in the water, older people...people are screaming, people are crying, losing their lives and their loved ones," he said.

The Kenya Red Cross has joined search and rescue operations, with its

emergency response manager, Anthony Muchiri, telling the BBC that the death toll has risen to 50.

"This is the worst I've ever come across in my career," he said, adding that not only were people's homes swept away, but also their foundations.

Of the bodies recovered so far, 17 were of children, police commander Stephen Kirui said, cited by Reuters news agency.

The sudden wave of floodwater was initially attributed to a nearby burst dam by local officials.

However, the Kenyan ministry of water, sanitation and irrigation said on Monday evening that the incident occurred as a result of a tunnel - which channels the River Tongi under a railway line - becoming blocked with "debris, stones, trees and soil" during the recent downpours.

This prevented water flowing through it to move downstream, leading to a pool of water suddenly sweep-

# Three police officers shot dead, five wounded in North Carolina home siege

Three law enforcement officers have been fatally shot and five others were wounded while serving a warrant in Charlotte, North Carolina, officials say.

At least one suspected attacker was found dead in the front yard of a barricaded home after a standoff that lasted three hours, police said.

Authorities said two shooters were involved in the attack.

The injured officers were part of a US Marshals Service-led task force.

They were attempting to serve a warrant for a felon wanted for possessing a firearm when gunfire erupted on the suburban street.

The officers returned fire at an assailant in the front yard, then more shots were fired at them from inside the home, Char-



lotte-Mecklenburg Police Chief Johnny Jennings told a news conference.

Shots were still ringing out more than two hours after the attack began on Monday in a residential area in the east of the city.

Residents were asked to shelter in place and nearby streets were closed to facilitate ambulance rescues. Several nearby schools were placed on lockdown during the siege.

On X, formerly Twitter, the Charlotte-Mecklenburg

Police Department asked people to "steer clear of the area".

"Residents stay inside of your homes," they said. "Multiple victims transported to nearby hospitals."

According to local network WSOC-TV, one US Marshal is among the dead law enforcement officers.

The attack ended when police stormed the home on Galway Drive.

Two other people who were inside the home with a suspect were being questioned, said police.

Witness Tyler Wilson told CBS News he was working at home when he heard police shout for the suspect to come out of the house.

"After that, it was just chaos," he said. "There was shots ringing left and right.

"We had Swat, and US Marshals set up snipers in our bedrooms. There was an officer [that] got dragged by his arms through our house."

"It's been pretty crazy," he continued. "It was about 30 minutes where it was a straight shootout."

Charlotte Mayor Vi Lyles said in a statement she was "deeply saddened by the shooting that occurred that involved Charlotte-Mecklenburg police officers and US Marshals today".

"I ask that all Charlotteans keep them, the other injured officers, and their families in your thoughts and prayers during this incredibly difficult time," she added.

ing over the railway line, the ministry said in a statement.

"The area has no dam and the only dam upstream in a different tributary is the Matches Dam which is in good condition and stable," it added.

The small villages of Kamuchiri and Kianugu were among those that bore the brunt of the disaster.

Peter Muhoho said that most of his neighbours were swept away in Kianugu, a village with about 18 homes.

"I was asleep when I heard a loud bang and screams. Water had flooded the area. We started rescuing people," Mr Muhoho told the BBC. Pointing to a bag he was holding, Mr Muhoho added: "This bag belongs to a chid I knew. He was washed away. I found it [the bag] downstream."

The government has delayed the opening of schools across Kenya with more rain expected, according to forecasters.

More than 130,000 people have been displaced by the floods, with many people taking shelter in schools.

Heavy rains have also pounded neighbouring Tanzania and Burundi.

At least 155 people have been killed in Tanzania since January.

In Burundi, nearly 100,000 people have been displaced.

The number of casualties is unclear.


