# Two days of natural phenomena, floods, earthquake, water-spout

It has been two days of natural phenomena with Antigua experiencing flooding in the southern corridor on Tuesday and on Wednesday both Antigua and Barbuda were shaken violently by an earthquake that sent many residents scampering for cover. To top it off, the Met Office reported that a water spout was spotted just off the northern coast of Antigua. This phenomenon was visible around 3:00 pm

Wednesday. (These special weather systems are called tornadoes over land and water spouts over water).

According to the Met Office the earthquake's epicenter was located some 27.3 miles southeast of Antigua making it closer to Guadeloupe. It had a depth of 6.2 miles and it measured 5.4 on the Richter Scale. It occurred approximately 10:43 am on Wednesday.

The Met Office de-

scribed it as moderate to high in terms of its intensity and according to reports from residents about their experiences. Many residents however reported hearing a loud noise at the same time they felt the earth shaking.

The National Office of Disaster Services (NODS) said it did not receive any reports of injuries or damage to property as a result of the earthquake.

The quake was report-

edly felt throughout the islands and other nearby territories such as St. Kitts/Nevis, Montserrat, St Martin and Dominica.

According to the UWI Seismic Research Centre in Trinidad that monitors earthquakes and volcanoes for English-speaking islands of the Eastern Caribbean, confirmed the findings of the Met Office.

NODS reported that there was no tsunami threat following the earthquake. It is important to note that the threat of a tsunami comes from an earthquake measuring magnitude 6.5 or more.

NODS encourages residents to be better prepared for such hazards by engaging in regular drills to include practicing to "Drop, Cover and Hold" – a safety measure advised by regional technicians during an earthquake. If inside a building,

# PM Browne calls on workers to unite against opponents of development

Prime Minister Gaston Browne has called on the workers of Antigua and Barbuda to unite on issues of national interest and not engage in the 'scorched earth politics' of those seeking power at any cost.

Prime Minister Browne was speaking at the annual Labour Day celebrations organized by the Antigua Trades and Labour Union and the Antigua and Barbuda Labour Party in St. John's on Monday. The Prime Minister referred to an article in Newsweek magazine which attempted to cast a negative shadow over the 41-year relations between Antigua and Barbuda and the People's Republic of China.

"I say to workers in this country, when it comes to issues of the national interest we must unite. We cannot follow and should not follow the scorched earth politics of those who want power at all cost, to tear down every institution, to tear down every relationship in this country. I bring to the attention of workers

in this country the recent pronouncement by the senior leadership of the UPP in which they joined with Newsweek to literally tear down Antiguans and Barbudans, to tear down our country and to undermine the relationship with the People's Republic of China; one of the most benevolent countries in the world that has contributed significantly to the development of Antigua and Barbuda," said Prime Minister Browne.

The country's leader was referring to an article in Newsweek Magazine by Didi Kirsten Tatlow which attempted to paint a distorted picture of Chinese involvement in Antigua and Barbuda. Among other things stated in the article, and supported by members of the opposition party here, it claimed to reveal information from leaked documents referring to a "Chinese-run special economic zone." This has been proven as false as the economic zone is a private venture and not operated by the government of China.

Prime Minister in his remarks on Labour Day, spoke of the many positive contributions made by the Chinese government towards the development of Antigua and Barbuda.

"They did not have the decency to remember and recall that during the leadership of the UPP, it is the same People's Republic of China that built out the airport facility with a concessional loan along with the Wadadli Power Plant, that ill-fated investment; the same People's Republic of China funded it under the UPP," said the Prime Min-

ister.

The Prime Minister also mentioned the Sir Vivian Richards Stadium, which was a gift to the government and people of Antigua and Barbuda, along with the Five Islands facility that was repurposed to house the University of the West Indies Five Islands Campus - that too was gifted to the people and government of Antigua and Barbuda during the tenure of the UPP, but yet still they have sought to demonize the People's Republic of China and the relationship with Antigua and Barbuda," said the country's leader.

Prime Minister Browne however warned members of the Opposition that "ungratefulness is worse than witchcraft and I say to you my comrades, no matter the circumstances, never fail to give thanks. No matter how small your achievement, never fail to give thanks," he said.

# Cabinet invites law-enforcement officials to discuss criminal activities

The Cabinet invited 17 officials from the country's law enforcement establishments to its meeting on Wednesday to discuss the recent spate of criminal activities perpetrated by a particular segment of the population.

The Cabinet Notes report that in attendance were the top brass of the Royal Police Force of Antigua and Barbuda, the Antigua and Barbuda Defence Force, the Organization of National Drug Control and Money Laundering Policy (ONDCP), the Fire Department, and an IT Specialist within the government service who collaborates with law enforcement.

One of the main themes that came up for discussion was what has become evident in recent times; the increase in the number of robberies by young males and other crimes involving the use of firearms.

"The Prime Minister explained that the Cabinet stands full-square with law enforcement, and the resources of the Treasury are to be made available in order to stem the tide of these violent crimes," the Cabinet Notes reported.

During the discussion, the Police Commissioner Atlee Rodney, noted that there can be no statistics for crimes prevented; however, patrols and 'Stop-and-Search' by the police and military act as a deterrent. The Police noted that there is a worrying trend where young men of a younger age are choosing to become criminals, and to seek out victims that are easier to rob.

It was agreed that all the data collected required analysis in order to determine the best strategy. Collaboration between the Antigua and Barbuda Transport Board and the Police to provide plate numbers as part of the anti-crime strategy has been assured. The security that has been organized for the SIDS4 conference, ICC T20 World Cup, and even Carnival 2024, is in place and will deter criminal activity.

The IT Specialist provided assurances that the public cameras are working and that the monitors will show images of events that are taking place on the ground.

# Murder-accused to make first appearance today


Murder-accused, 19-year-old Clarence Cameron of Bendals will be making his first court appearance today when he will have the charge of murder formally read to him following which he is expected to enter a plea.

The police reported on Wednesday that they arrested and charged Cameron with the murder of 17-yearold Omarrie Graham, also of Bendals.

It was reported that Graham and Cameron were involved in an altercation on Middle Road, Bendals, when he was allegedly stabbed with a sharp object.

The incident occurred on Saturday, May 4, around 9:35 pm. Graham was pronounced dead at 12:44 am at the Sir Lester Bird Medical Centre. The police later detained Cameron in connection with the homicide.

Meanwhile, the police are once again appealing to the general public to find non-confrontational ways of resolving differences, other than resorting to violent behavior. Members of the public are further encouraged to seek professional help in conflict resolution when it comes to settling family disputes.

# Antigua and Barbuda to welcome 500-thousandth cruise passenger today

Much excitement is expected at the St. John's Harbour today with the expectation that Antigua and Barbuda will create history by welcoming 500-thousand cruise ship passengers in just over four months.

Operations Manager at the Antigua Crise Port, Rawle Reynolds, said the achievement of 500-thousand cruise passengers ((half a million) in less than five months is a new record for Antigua and Barbuda.

"For the calendar year, 2024, to date we have welcomed 253 calls up to Sunday, May 5 and a total of over 496-thousand cruise

passengers. However, as of Thursday (May 9) two cruise ships are sailing into





### Security guard shot at Drake's Toronto home amid beef with Kendrick Lamar

Toronto police have said a security guard was shot overnight outside the home of Canadian rapper Drake.

Police said suspects in a vehicle shot the guard at the corner of the Park Lane Circle mansion around 02:00 EDT (06:00 GMT) on Tuesday before fleeing the scene.

It remains unclear if Drake was at home when the incident occurred or whether he was a target of the shooting.

He is currently embroiled in a war of words with US rap rival Kendrick Lamar.

But police said it was too early in their investigation to speak about a motive.

"We are in contact with [Drake's] team and they are cooperating," Inspector Paul Krawczyk of the Integrated Gun and Gang Task Force told reporters on Tuesday morning.

He said police are currently assess- to, is the subject of cover art for Laing video that captures the shooting but is not releasing information about it due to video quality issues.

The victim is in hospital and is in serious condition, he added.

Witnesses told Canadian media he had sustained several gunshot wounds, including one to the chest.

Toronto Mayor Olivia Chow told reporters she had been briefed by police about the shooting but declined to provide details.

"Any shooting is not welcome in this city and I hope the police will find the people that are violating the law and catch them," she said.

The lyrical beef between Drake and Lamar has grown bitterly personal, with a flurry of "diss tracks" exchanged between two of hip-hop's biggest stars over the weekend.

The Canadian's house, in the ritzy Bridle Path neighbourhood of Toronmar's latest song Not Like Us, which is currently topping US and global music charts.

In the song, Lamar accuses Drake of having relationships with underage women, and of harbouring a secret love child, with the image appearing to suggest he is housing multiple sex offenders under his roof.

Drake's response, The Heart Part 6, denies the allegations and says he "feels disgusted" by them.

The rapper has discussed his home, which he refers to as The Embassy, in his own music and on social media. Its gates are twice as high as permissible under city law, because of his security needs.

Pictures online show the property has been cordoned off with caution tape as police investigate the shooting.

The BBC has reached out to representatives of both artists for comment.

# Scientists decode 'whale language' around Dominica

Scientists studying the sperm whales that live around the Caribbean island of Dominica have described for the first time the basic elements of how they might be talking to each other, in an effort that could one day help better protect them.

Like many whales and dolphins, sperm whales are highly social mammals and communicate by squeezing air through their respiratory systems to make strings of rapid clicks that can sound like an extremely loud zipper underwater. The clicks are also used as a form of echolocation to help them track their prey.

Scientists have been trying for decades to understand what those clicks might mean, with only minimal progress. While they still don't know, they now think there are sets of clicks they believe make up a "phonetic alphabet" that the whales can use to build the very rough equivalent of what people think of as words and phrases.

"We're now starting to find the first building blocks of whale language," said David Gruber, founder and president of the Cetacean Translation Initiative or CETI, an effort devoted to translating the communication of sperm whales.

In a study published Tuesday in the journal Nature Communications, re-

searchers analyzed more than 8,700 snippets of sperm whale clicks, known as codas. They say they have found four basic components they think make up this phonetic alphabet.

Pratyusha Sharma, the paper's lead researcher, said this alphabet could then be used by the whales in an unlimited number of combinations.

"It doesn't appear that they have a fixed set of codas," said Sharma, an artificial intelligence and computer science expert at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. "That gives the whales access to a much larger communication system," she said, explaining it was as if the whales had a very large dictionary.

Sperm whales have the biggest brains of any animal on the planet at up to 20 pounds, as much as six times the size of an average human brain. Thy live in ma-

triarchal groups of about 10 and sometimes meet up with hundreds or thousands of other whales. Sperm whales can grow up to 60 feet (18 meters) long and dive to nearly 3,280 feet (1,000 meters) to hunt for squid. They sleep vertically, in groups.

Gruber, a biology professor at the City University of New York, said sperm whales seem to have sophisticated social ties and deciphering their communication systems could reveal parallels with human language and society.

To get enough examples of the sperm whale clicks in Dominica, where there is a resident population of about 200 whales, scientists created a giant underwater recording studio with microphones at different depths. Tags on the whales also record what position they are in when clicking — for example diving, sleeping, breathing at the surface — and if there

are any other whales nearby they might be communicating with.

Jeremy Goldbogen, an associate professor of oceans at Stanford University, called the new research "extraordinary," saying it had "vast implications for how we understand ocean giants."

Goldbogen, who was not involved in the study, said that if we were one day able to understand what sperm whales were saying, that knowledge should be used for conservation purposes, like minimizing their risk of being hit by ships or reducing ocean noise levels.

Sperm whales are classified as "vulnerable "by the International Union for Conservation of Nature. The whales were hunted for centuries for the oil contained in their giant heads and the species is still recovering.

# Bahamas minister warns of reprisal murders in his constituency

CMC - Foreign Affairs Minister, Fred Mitchell, is warning of reprisal killings in his Fox Hill constituency after a 37-year-old man was gunned down on Monday.

Mitchell in a WhatsApp message to his constituents, said he had been informed by Police Commissioner Clayton Fernander there could be reprisal killings after the man police described as major gang member was murdered this week.

"Good morning, the commissioner of police spoke with me this morning about a heightened state of alert in the Fox Hill area as a result of the murder of a fellow named Fox on Fleming Street.

"The police are expecting a set of tit-for-tat shootings in the area, and they will be increasing patrols in the area over the next period.

"Please exercise the appropriate level of caution, particularly around the public spaces in the parks," Mitchell said in his social



media message to his constituents.

Chief Superintendent of Police, Chrislyn Skippings, told reporters that initial information suggested that Michael Fox Jr, had pulled up to a residence on Fleming Street where he was immediately accosted by three masked males who exited another vehicle.

"These males, all of whom were armed with high-powered weapons, opened fire on the victim, shooting him multiple times," she said, adding that the deceased was well known to police and was associated with the Outlaws gang.

"He was on bail for firearm possession, but I'm going to limit my comments, any other information surrounding him and just leave it to that. He was a prolific offender that was well known to us. We've had him in our custody a number of times. We've spoken to him."

Fox's father, Michael Fox Sr, said his son was paralysed eight years ago after he was shot and that his son had been freed of gun related charges three years ago, but was picked up almost three years later and charged with the same offence.

"Every week he's arrested, and now you stating he's well known by police, but yet his record is clean. He can travel. He goes up and down. They take him off the plane the other day and arrest him by taking him off a plane travelling to go for therapy in the US, and they take him off the plane," he said, denying that his son was part of a gang.

Last month, the government tabled the Anti-Gang Bill (2024) bill, saying that it is a "critical step forward as we make our communities safer and more prosperous.

"Today, we are seeking to make it clear that this administration is willing to take on the organised gangs who destroy lives and communities. As they often say, enough is enough, Prime Minister Phillip Davis said, adding "we cannot tolerate the cycles of violence and retaliation that leave entire communities in fear."

munication expert at the City University of New York, said that scientists understand certain aspects of marine animals' communication reasonably well, including the whistles used by dolphins and the songs sung by hump-back whales.

But when it comes to sperm whales, even that basic knowledge is lacking.

"What's new in this study is that they are trying to look at the basis for the whales' communication system ... not just particular calls they're making," she said.

Reiss, who was not involved in the new research, said she hoped we would one day be able to match the whales' clicks to behaviour.

"We will never understand what the clicks mean to another whale, but we may be able to understand what the clicks mean enough to predict their behaviour," she said. "That alone would be an amazing achievement," she said.

CETI founder Gruber said millions and possibly billions of whale codas would be needed to collect enough data to try to work out what the whales are saying, but he expects AI to help speed the analysis.

He said other sperm whale populations — the whales are found in deep oceans from the Arctic to the Antarctic — likely communicate in slightly different ways.

# Grenada moving closer towards policy stance for cannabis industry

The Government of Grenada in keeping with its stated intention to develop a cannabis industry that will focus on the medical and industrial uses of the plant, is working to develop a comprehensive approach to the issue, ultimately leading to the passage of cannabis legislation.

The Ministry of Agriculture in an update said legislation will address the medical and scientific purposes of cannabis, as well as its potential to create employment and generate foreign exchange.

Minister for Agriculture and Lands, Forestry, and Marine Resources, Lennox J. Andrews, has expressed confidence in the members of a new working committee, saying they are committed to the mandate by the Cabinet to submit proposals on the way forward for the cannabis industry by September 2024.

"I have met with the committee, and they have all given their commitment to the task at hand, and I have full confidence that the committee will go to work within the time frame and deliver on time," he said.

The term of engagement of the previously established commission expired in November 2023.

After careful review and to expedite informed decision-making, the Cabinet opted to establish



a streamlined Cannabis Working Committee.

The Committee was established in April 2024 and consists of the following:

- Anselm Clouden, Attorney at Law
- Dr Shawn Charles, Chief Medical Officer
- ACP Vannie Curwen, Acting Commissioner of Police
- Tonja Alexander, a cannabis expert and Rastafarian representative.
- Betty Ann Lazarus, Public Relations, Ministry of Agriculture and Lands, Forestry, and Marine Resources

The Cannabis Working Committee's primary mandates includes engaging with the Grenadian community through extensive consultations in which the committee aims to understand the public's views on cannabis use and reclassification.

It also includes shaping Legislative and Regulatory Framework. Through informed public consultations, the committee will advise on designing a new legal and regulatory framework for cannabis.

At this stage, the Working Committee is moving beyond discussion and taking decisive action to achieve its mandates from the Cabinet.

The Working Committee's activities focus on gathering data and public opinion. The plan includes:

- 1. Publishing a Policy Statement: This document will outline the government's direction on cannabis legislation.
- 2. National Panel Discussion: Bringing together regional experts, this event will offer an opportunity to demystify cannabis, explore the realities of medical and

- scientific cannabis legalisation, and kick-start the national conversation.
- 3. Data Compilation and Analysis: Information gathered through all consultation processes will be meticulously compiled and analysed.
- 4. Collaboration with the Ministry of Legal Affairs: The committee will work closely with the Ministry of Legal Affairs to research and recommend legislative amendments for cannabis decriminalisation and depenalisation in this initial phase.

The Government of Grenada said it acknowledges the growing interest in cannabis legalisation as well as recognises the experiences of those impacted by current laws and appreciates public enthusiasm.

However, a responsible approach is crucial.

# German politician attacked in library as violence spreads

A Berlin senator and former mayor of the German capital has been attacked by a man in a local library in the latest of a spate of assaults on German politicians.

Franziska Giffey, a well known figure in Germany's centre-left SPD, was briefly treated in hospital after she was hit on the head and neck with a bag "filled with hard contents", police said.

Politicians and campaign workers have been targeted in recent days, especially in eastern Germany.

German Chancellor Olaf Scholz said the attacks were "outrageous and cowardly... Violence does not belong in a democratic debate".

Last Friday, a lead SPD candidate in next month's European elections was seriously hurt while putting up posters in Dresden.

Matthias Ecke, 41, had to have surgery in hospital after he was attacked by four people. Four teenagers are currently under investigation and at least one has been linked to the far right.

A campaign worker for the Greens in the city was beaten and kicked moments earlier.

Separately, a female Greens politician in Dresden also came under attack from two people while putting up posters on Tuesday evening.

Yvonne Mosler was pushed and spat on while she was out filming with a TV crew.

Dresden police said the two suspects, a man and a woman, had been part of a group that had been giving the Hitler salute when she began putting up election posters.

Colleagues reacted with shock to the attack on Franziska Giffey, Ber-

lin's senator with responsibility for the economy. Ms Giffey served in Angela Merkel's last federal government as minister for women and families before becoming mayor of Berlin in 2021.

Ms Giffey wrote later on Instagram that she had visited the Alt-Rudow library in the Neukölln district of south-east Berlin because it was a special place for her: "I would have never have thought it possible that I might come under attack there."

The Berlin ex-mayor said she was shocked at how people engaged in politics had increasingly become "fair game" for attack: "There is no justification for these attacks. A boundary has been crossed and we as a society must resist it decisively."

Police said they had detained a 74-year-old man already known to them for "state security and hate crimes". Prosecutors said there were indications the man was suffering from "a mental illness" and were assessing whether he should be admitted into psychiatric care.

Spranger condemned the spate of assaults on all politicians and campaign workers, "all of whom are committed to a robust democracy".

Federal and state interior ministers met on Tuesday to assess how to respond to the attacks.

Michael Stübgen, the Brandenburg minister who chairs the conference of interior ministers, told reporters that criminal law no longer gave politicians and campaigners adequate protection.

"Unfortunately we have see this spiral for years, and this year we are dealing with a violent spiral of physical attacks on female and male politicians, which I'm extremely worried about," he told local radio in Berlin.

The far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party is challenging for second place in European Parliament elections on 9 June, and hopes to become the dominant political party in state elections in eastern Germany in September.

# Biden to halt some arms supplies if Israel invades Rafah

President Joe Biden has warned Israel that the US will stop supplying some weapons if it launches a major ground operation in the Gaza city of Rafah.

"If they go into Rafah, I'm not supplying the weapons that have been used historically to deal with Rafah," he said during an interview with CNN.

He added that he would "continue to make sure Israel is secure".

Despite firm and vocal US opposition, Israel appears poised to mount a large-scale invasion of Rafah.

The congested part of southern Gaza is Hamas's last major stronghold in the territory. US officials have warned that an operation in the city - where the population has swelled with refugees from other parts of Gaza - could lead to extensive civilian casualties.

"We're not going to supply the weapons and artillery shells," Mr Biden said in the interview, which will air later on Wednesday.

He said the US did not define the current situation in Rafah as a ground operation. "They haven't gone into the population centres. What they did is right on the border," he said.

"But I've made it clear to [Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu] and the war cabinet, they're not going

to get our support, if in fact they go in these population centres."

Mr Biden acknowledged that US weapons had been used by Israel to kill civilians in Gaza,

The comments amount to the president's strongest warning yet over a potential ground invasion of Rafah, and mark the first time he has said the US could stop shipments of American weapons to Israel.

The US has already delayed a shipment of thousands of bombs to Israel, and has said it is reviewing future deliveries.

On Wednesday, Defence Secretary Lloyd Austin confirmed the delay of the bomb shipment - some of the most destructive munitions in Western military arsenals - while testifying in

front of the Senate.

The Israeli government said it was disappointed by the move.

The weapons being held back by the US are related to a future delivery, so the move is unlikely to have an immediate impact. But given the rate at which Israel is bombing it will probably affect future strikes fairly soon.

The Israeli military, meanwhile, has said that the two countries will resolve disagreements "behind closed doors".

President Biden faces mounting domestic pressure - from some Democrats and parts of the US public - to rein in Israeli operations in Gaza amid rising civilian deaths and a worsening humanitarian situation.

US officials confirmed

that no new aid supplies had been delivered in Gaza via two gates in the south since Israeli tanks rolled into southern Rafah and took control of the Palestinian side of the crossing with Egypt this week.

Israeli military spokesman Daniel Hagari said the US had provided "unprecedented" security assistance since the beginning of the war, adding that disputes between the allies were resolved "behind closed doors in a matter-of-fact way".

But a leading member of Mr Netanyahu's Likud party in Israel told BBC's Newshour on Wednesday he believed US domestic political considerations were behind the decision to halt the delivery of bombs.

Rafah has been a key entry point for aid, and the only exit for people able to flee, since the start of the war between Israel and Hamas last October.

The crossing remained closed on Wednesday morning, but the Israeli military said it was reopening the nearby Kerem Shalom crossing, which had been closed for four days because of Hamas rocket fire. On Monday, the Israeli military ordered tens of thousands of civilians to begin evacuating eastern parts of Rafah city, ahead of what it called a "limited" operation to eliminate Hamas fighters and dismantle infrastructure.

Meanwhile, efforts continue to reach a ceasefire, alongside the release of Israeli hostages and Palestinian prisoners. In Cairo, delegations from Israel and Hamas have resumed negotiations through mediators.

A US official said that talks with Israel were "ongoing and have not fully addressed our concerns" and the US had been reviewing its weapons transfers to Israel since April.

Israel launched a campaign to destroy Hamas in response to the group's cross-border attack on southern Israel on 7 October, during which about 1,200 people were killed and 252 others were taken hostage.

More than 34,780 people have been killed in Gaza since then, according to the territory's Hamas-run health ministry.

A deal agreed in November saw Hamas release 105 hostages in return for a week-long ceasefire and some 240 Palestinian prisoners in Israeli jails. Israel says 128 hostages are unaccounted for, 36 of whom are presumed dead.
