Courage and Faith – The foundation of ABLP's successes

The many remarkable successes that the Antigua and Barbuda Labour Party Administration achieved over the past ten years have been based on a foundation of courage and faith.

The assessment comes from Prime Minister Gaston Browne in an address Wednesday night to hundreds of party faithfuls gathered at the headquarters building, the People's Place, to celebrate ten unbroken years of good governance and solid economic gains for Antigua and Barbuda.

Speaking in a sombre mood, PM Browne said his administration inherited a country on the brink of bankruptcy on June 12, 2014, when it was returned to office following ten years under the now opposition United Progressive Party (UPP). It was a country and an economy in shambles, according to the prime minister.



"It was the first time in the history of Antigua and Barbuda that you had economic failure, financial failure and banking failure. In fact, there was no other country in the Caribbean that has had to contend with all three failures simultaneously. The economic failure was such that Antigua and Barbuda lost 25 percent of GDP between 2009 and 2013," he recalled.

The prime minister re-



vealed that one of the most pressing of the problems that the government inherited was a national debt of over \$3 billion with creditors, including the International Monetary Fund (IMF) knocking on the government's doors demanding payments.

The problem was compounded, he added, when it was discovered that many of the debts were not included in the national debt and that it took all the members of the Cabinet to 'put our shoulders to the plow' to help resolve the countries woes.

"We were able to stabilize our country's economy within the first year and then we embarked on

a number of projects in the succeeding years to the extent that we are now celebrating these successes in practically every sector of the economy," the ABLP Political Leader and Prime Minister noted.

He said many of the things that the government did to tackle the myriad of problems it faced; it did so because it had the courage.

PM Browne identified a number of issues that the government tackled for the good of Antigua and Barbuda. These include demanding that Sandals Resort pays over to the government the ABST taxes it collected, getting better deals from the Florida Caribbean Cruise Association for taxi-drivers, the purchase of WIOC and the negotiations with Antigua Power Company Ltd. to reduce the amount the Privy Council ordered to be paid to its owners over the Wadadli Power Plant deal.

The prime minister emphasized that he and his team are men and wom-




en of faith and it was this faith coupled with courage that allowed the country to overcome the many crises such as the COVID-19 pandemic.

Several church leaders were invited to the celebratory event as the prime minister further revealed that he consults regularly with Christian leaders as he continues to ask for God's guidance for both he and the Cabinet and generally for the people of Antigua and Barbuda.

One church leader, Dr Orson Daniel, was invited to pray for the prime minister and his Cabinet as well as for the people of Antigua and Barbuda.






Volunteers at the SIDS4 conference

Healthcare professionals receive training on the shipping of infectious substances

Laboratory technicians have successfully completed a training programme that focused on the safe way to ship infectious substances.

The course was designed for SLBMC laboratory staff and other laboratory professionals in Antigua and Barbuda to strengthen capacity and identify health security risks efficiently. Personnel attending the training also included staff from the Emergency Medical Services (EMS)

who are also involved in biomedical Regulations. material transport.

The Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA) collaborated with the Ministry of Health and Sir Lester Bird Medical Centre (SLB-MC) in organizing the course.

This training was also important for the laboratory staff to attain certification in accordance with International Air Transport Association (IATA) and Dangerous Goods

Barbara Joseph, SLBMC's Laboratory Service and Quality Manager noted the importance of the training not just for SLBMC but for the entire country; "These trainings will enhance Antigua and Barbuda's capacity to ship biological samples to reference laboratories in other countries for further testing and characterization. As a result, we're able to help speed up research and better serve patients."

"The Ministry of Health will continue to work with partner agencies to ensure shipping of infectious substance trainings continue in accordance with evolving health issues globally so that the country's laboratory services are strengthened," commented Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Kamaria DeCastro.

Carlos Rampersaud, CARPHA Biorisk Officer and facilitator of the training, stressed the importance of safe shipping through strict regulations to ensure that shippers are trained to safely ship biological specimens. "It is important for us to

have infectious substances shipped according to the standards, especially given the Cricket World Cup - as we have many persons visiting from over 25 countries to the region - and as such we must remain vigilant during this time to ensure if we have any outbreaks during our mass gatherings that we are prepared to ship during an emergency.

"The shipping of infectious substances and understanding of the relevant biosafety practices are of great importance as well as the training opportunities that will continue to be offered



to Antigua post the Cricket World Cup. We hope that the knowledge gained from this training will be shared among staff."

Training course participants expressed their gratitude for the training received. Coleen Gittens, SLBMC Medical Laboratory Technologist said, "We got a lot of practice packing. I now better understand why you pack the way you do and the role that different persons must play in the entire process. It's not just about the lab, it's about getting the material to where it needs to go safely, and we all have a role to play."

Kenja James, Laboratory Technician at SLBMC expressed a similar sentiment, "This course was a real eye-opening experience for me because I understand a lot more of the biological safety aspect of the samples - and why what we do and how we do it is done - the real reason behind all of it."

The training course syllabus included a mixture of both theoretical and practical elements. Initial faceto-face training and certification is followed by online training every two years to recertify and remain valid.

Evangelicals and the Abortion Law

Dear Editor,

Our Evangelical Alliance (EA) seem more concerned about the abortion law than about abortion.

Our current criminal law is ineffective. It does not protect fetal life. It does not stop abortions.

It is inequitable, since it only affects the vulnerable - the poor and the young.

It is harmful. It forces some women to take risks to end unwanted pregnancies.

It discriminates against women even when they have been victims of violence, whether rape or incest.

It discriminates because it absolves men from any responsibility whatsoever for unwanted pregnan-

Abortion is widespread in Antigua and the Caribbean: 65-74% of women will have at least one abortion by age 44. Most of them will have more than one.

The law is unenforced but remains available for arbitrary abuse.

About 80% of so-called teenage pregnancies are caused by men 20 years and older.

Sexual violence is endemic. At least 26% report experiences of forced sex, 19% have been abused by their partner and an appalling 19% report being sexually abused as a child.

We can change the law and address these facts, or we can continue to deny this reality.

The EA worries that bringing the abortion law in line with our modern Constitution and international conventions we have signed would "erode our nation's moral code." Really?

In the face of these data, which probably underrepresent the true sexual horror our women and girls encounter, what is the grand moral standard the EA seeks to protect?

The Government must summon the moral courage to take actions that are decades overdue: Decriminalize abortion, foster sexual education, improve contraceptive usage and hold sexual predators accountable.

Haiti's new government ministers sworn into office

CMC - Haiti's 12-member cabinet was sworn into office on Wednesday with Prime Minister Garry Conille underscoring the importance of peace and security in the French-speaking Caribbean Community (CARICOM) country.

Conille's attorney, Carlos Hercules, will be the Minister for Justice and Public Security and Haiti's ambassador to UNESCO, Dominique Dupuy, will be the Foreign Affairs Minister.

Princeton-educated Ketleen Florestal takes over the Finance Ministry from Michel Patrick Boisvert, who also served as interim prime minister this year.

In addition, the 58-yearold Conille, a former United Nations senior official, said his administration would crackdown on corruption.

"The fight against corruption will be an absolute priority of my government," Conille said, promising also regular audits of public resources.

"My government will work without rest to improve the conditions of each and every Haitian," he said, telling the ceremony that "without security, no sustainable progress can be achieved.

"It is crucial our police and soldiers are ready to

face today's security challenges. And we will ensure that they have the tools they need to carry out their mission effectively and professionally."

The ceremony comes less than 24 hours after a decree appointing members of the new cabinet was published in Haiti's official gazette, two weeks after the presidential transitional council (PTC) named Conille as interim prime minister.

PTC president, Edgard Leblanc Fils, said the government's goal is to "open a path to establishing free, democratic, credible and transparent elections".

Conille said Haiti's state institutions need to be "cleaned up and strengthened", speaking also of the humanitarian crisis gripping the CARICOM country

"My dear compatriots, Haiti is facing major challenges. Violence and security are paralysing our daily lives. The humanitarian crisis is exacerbating the suffering of our most vulnerable citizens."

Haiti has not held an election since 2016 with the country's last elected head

of state, Jovenel Moise, assassinated at his private residence overlooking the capital, Port au Prince, in July 2021.

Earlier this year, the US Department of State said the establishment of the new transitional council paves the way for "free and fair elections" in the country.

Last October, the United Nations Security Council approved a Kenya-led multinational force as efforts continue to restore peace and security in the country with criminal gangs reported to be in control of at least 80 per cent of the capital.

The Bahamas, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belize, Benin, Chad, Jamaica and Kenya have officially notified the Secretary-General of their intent to contribute personnel to the support mission.

Kenya's President William Ruto has said the deployment would likely start within a few weeks.

During the ceremony on Wednesday, Conille asked for a minute's silence, in memory of three police officers killed by gangs the previous Sunday.

More than 2,500 people were killed or injured in the first three months of the year and more than half a million others displaced.

St Vincent and the Grenadines: Hotels near full for ICC World Cup

St Vincent and the Grenadines has observed positive numbers in its hotel occupancy rate due to visitors and cricket teams on island for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup and upcoming Vincy Mas celebrations.

Tourism minister Carlos James in a news conference on Wednesday said 4,000 nights have been booked for the ICC World Cup across various suites of hotels, with hotels showing 75 per cent occupancy and some major ones close to 100 per cent.

He said of these rooms, technical and ground support staff to the teams, the ICC and Cricket West Indies account for about 200 rooms. The cricket teams account for over 1,400 rooms during the duration of the games.

Minister James believes for the final two games, SVG will be short on available room stock and is urging Airbnb providers and those not signed on as licensed providers to get in touch with the Tourism Authority to facilitate the addicont'd on pg 20

Buenos Aires rocked by clashes over Milei reforms

Riot police in Argentina's capital Buenos Aires have fired tear gas and water cannon to disperse protesters outside Congress, where lawmakers have been debating budget-slashing reforms.

Demonstrators - who say the measures will hurt millions of Argentines - threw petrol bombs and stones, setting one car alight.

A number of people were reported injured, with local media describing the scene on Wednesday as a "battlefield".

The reform package, proposed by right-wing President Javier Milei to revive the country's flagging economy, includes declaring a state of economic emergency, cutting pensions and watering down labour rights.

The measures are opposed by leftist political parties, labour unions and social organisations.

Scuffles broke out when protesters tried to make their way towards Congress through fences, with demonstrators throwing rocks at officers who pepper sprayed them.

Observers and opposition MPs reportedly said dozens of demonstrators and a handful of MPs received medical attention. At least five opposition MPs in the crowd were hospitalised, legislator Cecilia Moreau told AFP news agency.

Police later pushed back protesters, who reportedly set two vehicles on fire - including that of a news organisation.

tional rooms that he says are going to be needed.

Moving to the topic of Vincy Mas which runs from June 28 to July 9, 2024, the tourism minister said a spike in air transportation bookings has been observed with one airliner showing a 75 per cent load factor up to the end of August.

Russian warships arrive in Cuba in perceived show of force

Four Russian vessels - including a nuclear-powered submarine and a frigate - have arrived in Cuba, in what is seen as a show of force amid tensions with the West over the war in Ukraine.

The vessels are anchored at the Havana Bay - some 90 miles (145km) from the US state of Flori-

Russia's defence ministry says the Admiral Gorshkov frigate and the Kazan submarine are both carriers of advanced weapons, including hypersonic missiles Zircon. They earlier conducted missile drills in the Atlantic.

But Cuba's foreign ministry says none of the vessels has nuclear arms on board, and their five-day visit does not pose a threat to the region.

US officials say they are closely monitoring the visit.

The US Navy also used sea drones to shadow the Russian vessels as they got close to Cuba, BBC's US

partner CBS reports.

Early on a grey and overcast morning, the Russian vessels entered Havana Bay, flanked by smaller support vessels, to a 21-gun salute.

In a statement, Russia's defence minister said the visit was unofficial, allowing the vessels' crews to "rest and get acquainted with local attractions".

Russia has sent warships

to Cuba in the past and the two nations are long-standing allies - but the timing of these particular exercises stands out.

Coming amid growing tensions over Russia's fullscale invasion of Ukraine in 2022, the operation is being interpreted by some as sabre-rattling by Moscow.

Certainly, it appears to send a pretty clear message from the Kremlin to Washington about what they consider to be meddling in their backyard.

The visit is an important symbol of support to the communist-run government in Cuba and its socialist ally, Venezuela, where the warships may sail to next after they finish in Havana.

From the US perspective, officials have indicated that they are aware of the visit - but do not consider that it poses a threat to the US, adding that their understanding was that the nuclear-powered submarine was not carrying nuclear weapons.

In essence, while the visit may be considered broadly routine, the context of wider global hostilities in which it is taking place is anything but.

Nunez, a 55-year-old protesting lawyer, was quoted by AFP as saying.

President Milei's office issued a statement thanking the security forces for repressing what it described as "terrorists" attempting to carry out a coup d'état.

The debate on the bill in the Senate is set to continue late into Wednesday, with senators expected to take a vote on it.

The highly-divisive bill was approved

by the lower house in April, with significant changes.

If approved in the Senate, it will return to the lower hours for final approval.

Mr Milei came to office in 2023 after vowing to take a chainsaw to public spending.

While on the campaign trail, he even brandished a chainsaw while making a speech to symbolise his determination to do so.

India beat USA at T20 World Cup

WESTBURY, N.Y. (AP) — No upset this time for the United States as the home team was easily beaten by cricket heavyweight India at the Twenty20 World Cup on Wednesday.

Suryakumar Yadav's half-century powered India to a seven-wicket win over the USA, which had shocked Pakistan last week. With the win, India reached the "super eight" round. The USA still need to beat Ireland on Friday to advance.

Yadvav's 50 runs came off 49 balls, including two fours and two sixes. He put on 72 runs off 65 balls for the unbeaten fourth-wicket stand with Shivam Dube, who scored 31 not out, as India finished with 111 for three in 18.2 overs.

Left-arm pacer Arshdeep Singh took four for nine in four overs to restrict the co-hosts to 110 for eight off 20 overs after India had won the toss and opted to field at the Nassau County International Stadium.

India was in early trouble in their chase as Indian-born medium pacer Saurabh Netravalkar continued his golden run for the Americans.

After bowling the co-hosts to the upset over Pakistan, he celebrated the wickets of Indian superstars Rohit Sharma for three and Virat Kohli for a golden duck to finish with two for 18 in four overs. Rishabh Pant scored 18 off 20 balls, and India was reduced to 39 for three in 7.3 overs with the USA raising visions of an even bigger shock.

Yadav and Dube absorbed the pressure, however, and battled hard to carry India to victory.

India crossed 50 only after 11 overs. But the chase was given a boost when five penalty runs were awarded after the 15th over, with the USA guilty of running the clock past 60 seconds between overs on three separate occasions.

Yadav then took 15 runs off Shadley van Schalkwyk's 17th over, as India crossed the finish line with relative ease.

Earlier, Singh picked two wickets in the very first over as the Americans were reduced to three for two.

He trapped opener Shayan Jahangir lbw for a golden duck, while Andries Gous was out caught for two. Steven Taylor scored 24 off 30 balls to help recover the innings.

Singh returned later on to dismiss top-scorer Nitish Kumar for 27. His knock anchored the innings after the Americans were struggling at 56 for four in 11.4 overs.

Hardik Pandya also picked two for 14 in his four-over spell, accounting for stand-in skipper Aaron Jones for 11 and hard-hitting Corey Anderson for 15.

Australia beat Namibia and secure spot in T20 World Cup second round

Australia secured their place in the second round of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, producing a brilliant display in a nine-wicket win against Namibia at Sir Vivian Richards Stadium in Antigua on Tuesday night.

The Aussies produced a ruthless performance in all departments, chasing down the Namibians' total of 72 inside six overs.

Leg-spinner and Player of the Match Adam Zampa picked up a slice of history by taking four wickets for the Aussies, who had their African opponents all out for 72 in 17 overs.

Australia's captain Mitchel Marsh finally won a toss, having lost the other two so far this tournament, and he opted to send Namibia in to bat.

Australia enjoyed a dream first six overs, picking up three wickets for only 17 runs, piling pressure on the Namibians' top order. Josh Hazlewood was lethal with the ball, taking two for 10, bowling three overs inside the Powerplay.

Zampa joined the party soon after, as the Aussies continued displaying their supreme bowling depth. Namibia slumped to 21 for five off nine overs with the

removal of wicketkeeper Zane Green.

Captain Gerhard Erasmus then scored a rare boundary as Namibia got to 31 for five at the 10-over mark. But when Zampa and Hazlewood combined for the sixth wicket, the second ball after drinks, the African side found themselves in even more trouble. It was a crisp outfield catch from Hazelwood for Zampa's

second wicket.

Ruben Trumpelmann decided to go after the spinner, crunching a 97-metre six over mid-wicket. But the Namibian holed out to Glenn Maxwell at the same part of the ground next ball, handing Zampa his third wicket.

Zampa then ended his spell, in the same over, with wicket No.4, removing Bernard Scholtz to finish with figures of four wickets for 12 runs. The well-executed wrong'un also completed his path to 100 T20I wickets, becoming the first Australian men's player to reach that milestone.

Zampa joins Megan Schutt and Ellyse Perry as the only compatriots to reach that mark in the short format at international level.

Following on from an aggressive display with the ball, Australia's openers picked up the attack right from the outset. David Warner smashed 20 off eight balls before he was dismissed by

David Weise, who captured the only Australian wicket to fall.

But it didn't impact Travis Head's approach, who produced an impressive array of strokes on the way to a seven-boundary, 17-ball 34 not out. Head was supported by Mitchel Marsh, who struck 18 off nine balls, as Australia completed the run chase by scoring 74 for one in 5.4 overs.

Meanwhile, former champions Sri Lanka are on the brink of an early exit from the T20 World Cup after heavy rain washed out their Group D match against Nepal in Lauderhill, Florida, on Tuesday night.

The 2014 champions badly needed

a win to keep their tournament hopes alive after defeats by South Africa and Bangladesh in their first two matches.

Wanindu Hasaranga's team are bottom of the group with just one point and look certain to crash out unless other results go their way.

Nepal are also winless after two matches, and on Friday they face unbeaten group leaders South Africa, who sealed their place in the Super Eight after three straight victories.

Andrew hits century as West Indies Academy lose one-day series against Ireland

A century by Leeward Islands and Antiguan attacking middle-order batsman Jewel Andrew was unable to stop Cricket West Indies (CWI) Academy from losing their three-match one-day series against Ireland Emerging Players on Wednesday.

Hosts Ireland Emerging Players snatch a one-wicket victory with a ball to spare in the second one-day match at Bready to win the series by taking an unassailable two-nil lead against the young West Indies team.

Andrew, who was rested for Tuesday's opening match of the series, which Ireland Emerging Players won by six wickets, slammed 143 to guide the West Indies Academy to 278 for eight off their allotted 50 overs.

Andrew, who faced 141 balls and struck seven sixes and 12 fours, revived the faltering West Indies Academy innings with a 101-run sixth-wicket partnership with captain Nyeem Young.

Young struck 54 off 46 balls, including five sixes. Andrew was also involved in a 65-run fifth-wicket partnership with fellow Leeward Islands and Nevisian wicketkeeper batsman Carlon Bowen-Tuckett, who made 20 off 36 balls.

Pacer Liam McCarthy captured three for 80, and fellow fast bowler Tom Mayes claimed two for 61. In reply, the Ireland Emerging Players snatched victory at 282 for nine in 49.5 overs.

The West Indies Academy appeared on course to a series-leveling victory when they reduced Ireland Emerging Players to 240 for nine in the 48th over.

At that stage, Ireland Emerging Players still needed 39 runs to win off 17 balls, with one wicket remaining. The hosts got 42 runs off 16 balls to snatch their series-clinching victory.

The hero was No. 10 batsman Matthew Humphreys, who slammed 39 not out off 14 balls, including four sixes and a four. Opener Chris de Freitas top scored with 84, and middle-order batsman Morgan Topping made 53.

Pacer Johann Layne captured three for 55; fellow pacer Ramon Simmonds took two for 5; and Nyeem Young claimed two for 67.

A top score of 82 from Leonardo Julien failed to inspire the Cricket West Indies Academy, as hosts Ireland Emerging Players took a 1-0 lead in their three-match, one-day series when they cruised to a six-wicket win in Eglington on Tuesday.

The 22-year-old Trinidadian left-

hander cracked nine fours and four sixes from 61 balls and was the cornerstone of the CWI Academy batting before they were bowled out for 224 in 43.1 overs after they were put in to bat in the 50 overs-a-side match at Woodvale Road.

Pacers Johann Layne and Joshua James then grabbed two wickets apiece for the visitors, but an unbeaten 66 off 85 balls from Morgan Topping led to solid top-order batting as the Irish replied with 227 for four in 46.5 overs.

The teams will clash in the decisive third and final match of the one-day series at the same venue in Bready on Friday.

They will then engage each other in the first of two four-day matches in North Down from June 18-21. The second and final four-day match will take place in Stormont from June 25-28.
