Revenue growth on pace to set new records

the performance of the economy has been the growth in revenues for the year.

This year, the government added two percent to the ABST to move it from 15 percent to 17 percent along with other measures to improve revenues.

The year is not yet over and the and government's revenues have seen strong growth in the first ten months of the year.

The financial secretary, Rasona Davis-Crump is confident that the ABST, which was projected at will be surpassed when the final figures are tabulated.

Meanwhile, Comptroller of Customs, Raju Boddu is reporting that as of October 31, 2024, revenues at his department totaled \$397.1 million compared with \$327.6 million for the same period last vear.

This is an increase of \$69.50 million, or an increase of twenty-one point two one percent (21.21%).

For the month of October, revenues amounted to over \$46 million, another increase over the amount

Another indicator of \$413.6million this year, for the same month last my (market prices) was vear.

> All this translates in the Antigua and Barbuda economy doubling in size between 2014 and 2024. Based on data from the ministry of finance, the economy will value in excess of \$6 billion by yearend.

> Up from the roughly \$3 billion in 2014. There are signs that the country's economy is back on track with the pandemic decline a distant sight in the rearview mirror.

> "At the end of 2019, the value of the econo-

\$4.5 billion. Based on the growth that we have achieved so far, we are looking at in excess of \$6 billion for 2024.

"This growth is expected to continue into 2025. Our projections are that by the end of 2025 we will be at \$6.5 billion, roughly \$2 billion more than it was for 2019," Davis-Crump remarked.

She added that 'all this is predicated' on the expectations that the anticipated growth in tourism and in construction will continue.

Foreign Minister Greene shines the light on the Caribbean's vision to host a World Expo

Foreign Minister E.P Chet Greene highlighted the individual charm and beauty of Caribbean countries as he focused the spotlight on what he described as a Caribbean vision to host a World Exposition at some point in the future.

FM Greene was speaking Monday morning at the opening of Bureau International des Expositions (BIE) Capacity Building workshop taking place at Royalton Hotel from November 4-6. BIE with funding from the European Union is conducting the training, which is the first such event to take place in the Caribbean.

In his remarks, Greene identified the unique characteristics of each Caribbe-

each country can maximise its participation in Expos to forge new ties, strengthen existing connections, and create new possibilities for cultural and economic development.



Three persons to receive honour by the ABAT in Toronto

Antigua and Barbuda's 43rd Independence Day celebrations continue in the north with the Antigua and Barbuda Association of Toronto. The celebration gala will honour three notable nationals Mitzi Allen, Joy Lapps and Rodman George.

The gala will take place on November 9th, 2024 at the Viceroy Banquet Hall in Toronto and is hosted by the Antigua and Barbuda Association of Toronto with support from the Antigua and Barbuda Tourism Authority.

Tameka Wharton, Director of Tourism (Canada) explains that "The Antigua and Barbuda Tourism Authority has been on a reinvigorating venture of diaspora engagement for 2024." She says that the upcoming Independence Gala in Toronto is "an excellent avenue to remind our people that the efforts of promoting Antigua and Barbuda can be that much stronger if the diaspora shares their talent, skills and connections across their newly found community, and tell Canadians about their homeland."

Amongst the three honourees, is Mitzi Allen, an award-winning broadcast journalist and film and television producer, who was the first black reporter on CFTO-TV in Toronto in the 1980s. Powered by solar panels, it was the first of its kind on the island. In 2017, Hurricane Irma severely damaged Uncle Roddy's but it has, to date, been

Health technicians undergo training

Technicians attached to several of the units within the ministry of health are undergoing a weeklong training as part of the Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARHA)'s recently approved Regional Integrated Public Health Surveillance Strategy.

Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Health responsible for primary health care, Stacy Gregg-Paige, said the objectives of the training exercise are critical to vector control in the country.

"The objectives of this meeting are vital for ensuring that our vector management strategies are both comprehensive and effective. Over the next several days, you will assess the capabilities of entomology laboratories; receive training in laboratory techniques



related to the aedes aegypti mosquito and develop robust feedback mechanism for entomological indices and vector control operations," she stated.

Gregg-Paige urged the partici-

pants to absorb the training as it will enhance their ability to carry out their vector control strategies more effectively. "Each day will bring you a step

closer to strengthening your approaches and fine tuning your integrated vector control strategy. These efforts are essential for reducing the threat of vector-borne diseases and for advancing our mission to protect and promote health and wellness throughout our communities," she remarked.

Principal Public Health Supervisor, Julienne Mannix, said the training is geared towards building the capacity of the technicians to do entomological surveillance in a laboratory setting. Participants are attending from various units within the health ministry. These are the Vector Control Unit, the Epidemiology Unit, the Analytical Services at Dunbar's and public health inspectors.

CARPHA is currently rolling-out the approved Regional Integrated Public Health Surveillance Strategy across its Members States. Under one of the priority areas for this strategy, CARPHA is seeking to build surveillance capacity for the prevention and control of vector borne diseases using a multi-sectoral approach. The foundational step in this process involves the development of a National Integrated Vector Management (IVM) strategy.

A lawyer for the families say they want TikTok's legal liability for harmful content to be recognised in court.

French families sue TikTok over harmful content

TikTok is being sued by seven families in France, who accuse the social media giant of exposing their children to harmful content - leading two to take their own lives.

The case alleges the video platform's algorithm exposed them to content promoting self-harm, eating disorders and suicide, said Laure Boutron-Marmion, a lawyer for the families. She told French media that the lawsuit was the first of its kind in Europe.

TikTok, which is one of the world's most popular social media platforms, said it had not received any notifications of legal proceedings relating to the claims.

The company added in a statement that its community guidelines do not allow for the showing, promoting or sharing plans for suicide or self-harm, and that it uses a combination of technology and moderation to ensure these standards are upheld.

The group lawsuit, which has been filed in the Créteil judicial court, is

separate to a criminal complaint filed against TikTok last year by the parents of Marie - one of the two teenagers who killed herself.

Marie, whose surname has not been used in reporting, was 15 when she took her own life in 2021. Her death, according to her mother, was due in part to the video content that she was able to access on TikTok without moderation.

Another girl whose family is involved in the lawsuit also died by suicide, while four of the other five young women attempted to take their own lives. At least one of them had developed an eating disorder.

"The parents want TikTok's legal liability to be recognised in court", Ms Boutron-Marmion told broadcaster Franceinfo.

"This is a commercial company offering a product to consumers who are, in addition, minors. They must, therefore, answer for the product's shortcomings."

TikTok, like other major social networks, has faced scrutiny and crit-

icism over its safeguarding practices.

More than a dozen US states recently sued the company - accusing it of helping to drive a mental health crisis among teenagers.

Last year, the European Union opened an investigation into whether it had breached new safety laws relating to the protection of minors, among other areas.

In an interview in April, Ms Boutron-Marmion told French legal news site Actu-Juridique that cases such as that of Molly Russell, the British schoolgirl who killed herself in 2017 after seeing graphic images of self-harm and suicide online on Instagram and Pinterest, were increasing awareness of the need for greater accountability when it comes to social media content.

"Parents are starting to wake up. Many of them were unaware of the horrors that were circulating on the platforms. While I have noticed a change in mentalities, the problem remains: addiction persists, including among adults."

TCI launches Border Force to boost national security

CMC - The government of the Turks and Caicos Islands has officially launched its Border Force, marking the culmination of a three-year endeavour spearheaded by the Ministry of Immigration and Border Services, which has seen a significant expansion of enforcement and intelligence teams, substantial investments in cutting-edge technology, and the implementation of robust legislative frameworks.

The newly established Border Force is poised to play a pivotal role in safeguarding the islands from a myriad of threats, including human trafficking, drug smuggling, and other transnational crimes.

It will also facilitate the smooth and secure flow of legitimate trade and tourism, ensuring that TCI remains a welcoming and prosperous destination.

Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Immigration and Border Control Althea Been, hailed last week's launch as a "historic moment" for the islands, emphasising the Border Force's commitment to "the safety, integrity, and sovereignty" of the nation.

She acknowledged the unique challenges posed by the islands' geographical location and underscored the need for "vigilant protection and management" of its



borders.

Been also provided insights into the meticulous planning and execution that led to the creation of the Border Force.

"From the inception, my team and I recognized that this vision required industrious people, effective and enabling policies, and modern-day world-class systems for it to come to fruition," she stated.

Minister of Immigration and Border Services, Arlington Musgrove, echoed Been's sentiments, expressing his immense pride in the government's achievement.

"The establishment of the TCI Border Force stands as one of our most significant accomplishments, a transformation that reflects our steadfast dedication to

securing our shores and uplifting our people," he declared.

Musgrove highlighted the Border Force's comprehensive approach to border control, which includes the deployment of advanced technology such as drones and biometric data. He also emphasised the importance of transparency and accountability, citing the implementation of body-worn cameras and other measures aimed at fostering public trust.

Cayman Islands Governor says govt can function once it has a quorum in Cabinet



CMC - Governor Jane Owen says "calm and stable government" remains the priority in the Cayman Islands that is dealing with the second collapse of a coalition government within a four-year period.

Last Thursday, four members of Parliament, including the Deputy Premier André Ebanks, resigned from the government.

The others are the Sustainability and Climate Resiliency Minister, Katherine Ebanks-Wilks, Health Minister Sabrina Turner and Parliamentary Secretary Heather Bodden who have left the United People's Movement (UPM) with immediate effect.

"In recent months in particular, the level of dysfunction and disorganisation, and a lack of professionalism, places the country at risk of erroneous decision making and reputational damage which could have long-term adverse consequences," the four said in a joint statement.

In a statement, Owen said that she appreciates that "this has been an uncertain time for many people throughout our islands" and that she is closely following developments after the resignation of four members of the UPM government.

"As many have said already, calm and stable government remains the priority. As you all know, Cayman has a strong constitution that has stood the test of time and robust democratic principles upon which our constitution is based.

"We will have constant reference to these as discussions continue. Under the constitution, the Cabinet can continue to function provided it has a quorum of five ministers, including the Premier," the Governor said.

She said the Civil Service will also continue to provide public services and policy implementation as they always do, promising to "provide further updates to you in due course, so I encourage you to remain tuned in to all official channels"

Last week, the opposition Progressives Party said that while it is "carefully considering its options" it "stands ready to provide the leadership the Cayman Islands needs".

The Progressives in a brief statement noted the resignations highlight "an urgent crisis" in the government, one that threatens Cayman's "stability and unity."

"We must act with urgency, resolve, and a relentless commitment to the future of our islands. We must restore unity and stability to the business of government. Cayman deserves nothing less," the party said.

Former premier McKeeva Bush warned that "pushing the country into an early election does not speak well for a stable country."

Fresh flooding hits Barcelona as Spain rescuers search underground parking

The Spanish city of Barcelona was hit by flooding on Monday, as search and rescue efforts continue following devastating flooding around Valencia last week.

Spain's state meteorological agency has placed parts of Catalonia on red alert for torrential rain, with local media showing footage of cars partially submerged on a highway.

Parts of the Barcelona's El Prat airport, the second largest in the country, have been flooded. More than 80 flights have been cancelled or delayed, while rail services have been suspended.

A similar weather event, which hit the Valencia region with a year's worth of rain last week, has caused at least 217 deaths. On Monday, rescuers focused their efforts on searching for missing people in underground car parks.

The storm caught many victims in their vehicles on roads and in underground spaces, such as car parks, tunnels and garages, where rescue operations are particularly difficult.

It is feared shoppers and workers were trapped inside the car park at a shopping mall in Aldaia, on the outskirts of Valencia, as floodwater overwhelmed the area.

Police have confirmed that no victims were located in the first 50 vehicles inspected at the site.

But reports suggest these vehicles were found near the entrance to the car park, with much of the rest of it still submerged and yet to be explored.

Among the dead were a British couple in their 70s, whose family confirmed they had been found dead in their car days after the flash floods hit Valencia. So far no deaths have been reported in Catalonia.

On Monday morning, Spain's interior minister refused to say how many were still missing.



European football body Uefa said a minute's silence would be held at club competition matches "in memory of the victims" and those impacted by the floods. Real Madrid and Barcelona FC are due to play on Tuesday and Wednesday, respectively.

Outside the Bonaire shopping mall in Aldaia, rotting piles of debris lined the roads while noisy generators pumped water from the mall car park.

Spanish police were using drones to get an initial view of the inside, a police spokesperson said.

When the BBC asked a local police officer how much longer the operation would take, he said he could not give an estimate, but that teams would stay as long as necessary.

As is the case in many parts of the region that have been devastated by the floods, there is a vacuum of information.

There has been anger at a perceived lack of warning and insufficient support from authorities after the floods.

On Sunday, the king and queen of Spain were pelted with mud and other objects by angry protesters during a visit to the town of Paiporta - one of the worst-affected in the Valencia region.

Objects were also thrown at Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez, who was quickly evacuated.

The Civil Guard has opened an investigation into the chaotic scenes, Interior Minister Fernando Grande-Marlaska told public broadcaster TVE.

He blamed "marginal groups" for instigating the violence where mud spattered the monarchs' face and clothes.

In a news conference on Monday, the chief of Spain's Military Emergencies Unit (UME) said it had pre-deployed 500 troops to Valencia so they could begin working as soon as they were authorised to.

General Francisco Javier Marcos said that when he saw the situation worsen, he sent alerts to 1,000 soldiers, who travelled overnight "so that by dawn the next day, people of Valencia could see that the armed forces were there".

He added: "You might say we didn't intervene rapidly. The weather prevented that partially, and secondly, it was a matter of order and discipline.

"You might say that doesn't justify being slow - well look, you can't bring more chaos to an already very chaotic situation."

Local authorities in Valencia have extended travel restrictions for another two days to facilitate the work of the emergency services, cancelled school classes and urged people to work from cont'd on pg 17

Modi condemns violence after Canada temple incident

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has criticised the "cowardly attempts to intimidate our diplomats" in a deepening diplomatic row with Canada.

Both countries expelled each other's top envoys last month after Canadian officials accused India of being involved in violent acts targeting Indian dissidents on Canadian soil, something the country denies.

Modi's comments came after violence broke out at a Hindu temple in the Canadian city of Brampton on Sunday, which he has called a "deliberate attack".

"Such acts of violence will never weaken India's resolve. We expect the Canadian government to ensure justice and uphold the rule of law," he wrote on X.

Local police said three people have so far been arrested and charged over the incident in Brampton, near Toronto, but did not provide further details.

The force said "several acts of unlawfulness continue to be actively investigated" by its officers.

Unverified video posted online appeared to show people carrying yellow flags of the Khalistan movement - which demands a separate Sikh homeland in India - clashing with others holding Indian flags.

India's foreign ministry said "extremists and separatists" were behind the violence, calling on the Canadian government to "ensure that all places of worship are protected from such attacks".

The North America-based activist group Sikhs for Justice, meanwhile, described the incident as an "unprovoked violent attack on peaceful pro-Khalistan demonstrators".

Justin Trudeau wrote on X that Sunday's violence was "unacceptable", adding that "every Canadian has the right to practice their faith freely and safely".



Monday's comments are the first time Narendra Modi has spoken about the cooling of relations with Canada.

Relations between India and Canada have soured since Ottawa accused the Indian government of being behind the 2023 killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a naturalised Canadian citizen who is labelled a terrorist in India.

India has vehemently denied this and other allegations and maintained that Canada has provided no evidence to support its claims.

Mr Nijjar had been a vocal supporter of the Khalistan movement and publicly campaigned for it. The rift between Canada and India has raised questions over the impact it could have on the deep trade and immigration ties between both countries.

Bilateral trade is worth billions of dollars, and Canada is home to nearly 1.7 million people of Indian origin.

Neither country has yet imposed tariffs or other economic forms of retaliation, but experts caution that this could change, and that a cooling relationship between India and Canada could hinder further economic growth.

Gen Marcos said gridlock on some roads was making it hard to distribute food to the 69 affected municipalities.

He said that the number of troops on the ground had been "scaled up" - with 7,800 due by 20:00 local time (19:00 GMT) on Monday. These were being supported by 17,000 volunteers and 5,000 army soldiers offering logistical support, he said.

A warship carrying 104 marine infantry soldiers as well as trucks with food and water docked in Valencia's port on Monday. Gen Marcos said the UME was "doing everything we can", including working double shifts.

He added: "We must be disciplined and we must be patient. I know that's hard, because pain and emotion means that's not easy."

In Catalonia, the Ministry for Ecology said that the State Meteorological

Agency (Aemet) had issued a red alert due to the "extreme danger" of torrential rains. Aemet is warning that up to 8cm of rain could fall across coastal areas into Tuesday morning - but that localised downpours could lead to "very different" accumulations between nearby towns.

The flooding in Valencia was caused by a Dana phenomenon - when warm, moist air meets cold air, creating an unstable weather system.

Richards leads Pride to victory over Harpy Eagles

The Barbados Pride registered their third win on the trot in the CG United Super50 Cup as they downed Guyana Harpy Eagles by one wicket in a nail-biting contest at the Queen's Park Oval in Trinidad and Tobago on Sunday.

Demetrius Richards' patient unbeaten 65 off 121 balls, including five fours and one six, steered Barbados Pride to their victory target at 204 for nine after they won the toss and bowled out Harpy Eagles for 203 inside 48 overs.

With the win, Barbados Pride moved to the summit of the standings on 22 points, one point ahead of Trinidad and Tobago Red Force (21 points), while Harpy Eagles sit fourth on 12 points.

Asked to take first strike, the Harpy Eagles, who lost their first encounter and had their second contest end in a no-result, would have been intent on opening their account but were let down by a sub-standard batting performance.

They lost in-form Matthew Nandu (14) with the score at 19 for one, but Tagenarine Chanderpaul (34) and captain Tevin Imlach (35) gradually got the innings back on track with a 49-run second wicket stand.

Anderson, who used 72 balls for his 52, had two boundaries in the knock, while Paul had two sixes and a four in his 15-ball cameo. Ashmead Need (19) offered little at the backend.

Leacock (3-43) was the pick of the Pride bowlers, with Dominic Drakes (2-38), Nyeem Young (2-29), and Jomel Warrican (2-27) offering support.

Three of those four wickets fell to slow left-arm orthodox bowler Nedd, with the other going to Veerasammy Permaul.

Captain Kyle Mayers (22) and Dominic Drakes (13) offered very little resistance as the Pride slipped to 115 for six before a 55-run stand between Richards and Nyeem Young (30) brought them within touching distance of victory.

Even after losing Young, Richards pushed on to ensure they got across the line. Nedd ended with three for 43.
