Four stolen vehicles found as search for Orden Passo David intensifies

Four vehicles which have been reported stolen...have been found by the police stripped of their parts as the police search for Orden Passo David intensifies.

A STRATCOM statement said on Tuesday, February 18, police officers from various departments launched an extensive search operation on the eastern side of Antigua in an effort to find Orden David.

"The team of over 50 dedicated officers gathered at Willikies Police Station around 5:30 a.m. for a strategic briefing before commencing search at 7:15 a.m. The search covered several key areas, including Pares and around Sir Vivian Richards Stadium. During the operation, four vehicles suspected of being stolen were found partially stripped of their parts," according to



the release.

Accordingly, the vehicles were examined by the Forensic Evidence Recovery Unit (FERU), and arranged to be transported to Police Headquarters for further investigation. The operation lasted over four hours; however, there were still no sightings of Orden David.

The search will continue, and the public is asked to assist by providing any information regarding Orden David's whereabouts or the circumstances surrounding his disappearance. You may do so by contacting the Criminal Investigations Department at 462-3913 or Bolans Police Station at 462-1080.

On Saturday, the police made a significant breakthrough in the case after obtaining valuable information that led to the discovery of his burnt-out Honda Fit motorcar, hidden among bushes behind Pares Secondary School. This crucial piece of evidence has since been taken to the headquarters for further investigation.

Antigua and Barbuda and Pakistan have expressed a desire to have improved relations in both in trade and people-to-people exchanges.

These were some of the sentiments expressed on Tuesday when Prime Minister Gaston Browne welcomed the Pakistani High Commissioner to Antigua and Barbuda, Shahbaz M. Malik, and delegation to St. John's.

PM Browne noted that both countries established diplomatic relations back in1981 and take it was time to take the relationship to the next level. "I'm hoping that your appointment will signal an improvement in the relationship as we seek to improve people to people exchanges as well as the possibilities of trade between our two countries. In the area of the exchange of expertise, we have here the 4th landed campus of the University of the West Indies and I certainly hope that there may be some collaborations at that level," he remarked.

The prime minister expressed the view that the relationship between both countries has spanned decades and now can be elevated, adding that there are areas where both countries can benefit from some level of trade.

He noted that Antigua and Barbuda is keen on expanding its reach with countries

such as Pakistan, a large country with a large population (the world's fifth largest). Using both China and India as examples, PM Browne said he is of the view that Pakistan could also see similar economic growth as its large population is one of the keys to such growth. "With your population and resources, it is just a matter of time," he observed.

In his response, High Commissioner Malik said Pakistan is keen on enhancing its relationship with the smaller islands of the Caribbean, not only in the political sphere but also in the areas of trade and commerce.

"As you are aware, Pakistan has a well-developed textiles industry, pharmaceutical industry, sports industry and agriculture. There are several areas in which we therefore can cooperate and I will keep in touch with your Ministry of Foreign Affairs on this matter," he remarked.

The High Commissioner expressed a desire for the two countries to establish what he termed 'parliamentary friendship groups' which will organize exchange visits between both countries to help strengthen relations. He also suggested the appointments of Honorary Consuls to further enhance the relationship.

The Pakistani diplomat noted that his country has several 'surgical groups' as well as trained doctors and nurses who are available to take up assignments within the health sector of Antigua and Barbuda if requested.





Regional News Anguilla: Shooting claims the life of man, 29, investigations underway

The Royal Anguilla Police Force has confirmed the death of a 29-year-old man following a shooting incident at Hill Side Bar in South Hill.

The incident occurred shortly after midnight today when police received reports of gunfire at the popular Back Street location.

The victim has been identified as Omarí Roberts, a resident of the British Virgin Islands. Roberts arrived on Anguilla just three days prior, on February 14. Authorities are still piecing together the circumstances surrounding the incident.

In response to the shooting, police have closed off the section of road near Hill Side Bar to all traffic while an investigation is underway.

The motive for the shooting remains unclear.

The Royal Anguilla Police Force has appealed to the

public for any information that could aid in their investigation. "We are urging anyone who may have seen or heard anything suspicious in the area to come forward. Any information, no matter how small, may assist in our ongoing investigation," the police said. (Loop Caribbean)



Smith was allegedly accosted by a group of men, one reportedly armed with a gun, at a dance in Ackee Walk,

St Andrew, the police reported.

An altercation ensued resulting in Smith being shot and killed.

Prior to his death, Smith had injured Munga Honorable in a machete attack.

Smith was a nephew of entertainer Mr Vegas.

Attorney-at-law Kaysian Kennedy Sherman is also representing Rhoden.

King's Counsel Peter Champagnie is representing his co-accused.

The men have denied involvement in the killing. (Jamaica Gleaner)

A dispute between two Haitian men outside a bar in Windsor Forest, eastern Portland, ended with one of them dead on Sunday night. Shortly before midnight, the men got into a heated argument which turned physical when one man punched the other in the face, according to a police report.

The man reportedly fell and hit the back of his head on the asphalt, leaving him motionless.

Attempts to revive him, including dousing him with water, were unsuccessful.

He was rushed to the Port Antonio Hospital, about 10 miles away, but died while undergoing treatment.

Witnesses say at least three other men then attacked the Haitian aggressor, beating and kicking him as he pleaded for his life.

His status is not immediately clear.

It's believed that the men are part of a group of Haitians who entered the island illegally last year and have been hiding in the area. (*Jamaica Gleaner*)

International AROUND THE WORLD **UN calls for calm as violence flares in South Sudan**

The United Nations has called for calm as it reported deadly clashes in South Sudan have killed civilians and wounded a peacekeeper.

Fighting broke out between the South Sudan People's Defence Forces (SSPSF) and "armed youth" in Nasir in Upper Nile state – which borders Sudan - on February 14 and 15, the UN mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) said in a statement on Monday.

The oil-rich but impoverished nation, which achieved independence only in 2011, is plagued by instability with frequent clashes and political infighting.

The UN did not identify the armed groups that clashed with the SSPSF, a national military force led by President Salva Kiir, head of the country's unity government.

The statement said some fighters used "heavy weaponry which has, reportedly, resulted in deaths and injuries to civilians as well as armed personnel".

It did not give any details on the number of people hurt, but added that a UN peacekeeper on a scheduled patrol was wounded during mortar shelling.

Nicholas Haysom, special representative of the UN secretary-general and head of UNMISS, called for



an immediate end to the violence.

"I urge all involved to demonstrate restraint and immediately restore calm. I also strongly condemn any violence against our peacekeepers and reiterate that

such actions constitute a violation of international law," said Haysom.

The UN statement also warned of "persistent tensions" in Western Equatoria state – on the other side of the country – between "or-



Haysom said the situation in both locations underscored the need for the full deployment of South Sudan's unified armed forces.

The country endured a vicious five-year civil war between Kiir and his bitter rival, Vice President Riek Machar. A 2018 peace deal required the unification of armed forces ahead of repeatedly delayed elections.

UNMISS has said the unification of the army has yet to be achieved. (Al Jazeera English)

U.S. and Russia hold high-level talks that exclude Ukraine and Europe

The United States and Russia on Tuesday held high-level talks marking President Donald Trump's reversal of American policy on Moscow, fueling fears in Kyiv and building the Kremlin's hopes of reentering the international mainstream.

Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Russia's Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov met for four-and-a-half hours in Saudi Arabia, which is mediating the talks and is itself looking to boost its credentials as a world power.

The talks were successful, Yuri Ushakov, Russian President Vladimir Putin's foreign policy adviser, told the state-owned TASS news agency. He added that they had paved a way for a possible meeting between Trump and Putin, although he did not say when that might take place.

While attention in Europe was focused on the war in Ukraine, the meeting is a major turning point in Washington's relationship with Moscow, which has been diplomatically and financially isolated since it launched its February 2022 invasion of Ukraine.

"This is that second step to determine if the Russians perhaps are serious, and if they're on the same page," State Department spokesperson Tammy Bruce told reporters Monday, following Trump's announcement last week that he and President Vladimir Putin had held a 90-minute conversation.

As the deadliest war in Europe since World War II rages in Ukraine, the country's president, Volodymyr Zelenskyy, and other European leaders are alarmed and dismayed at being shut out of the talks. One of Kyiv's main concerns was that Russia would be given the go-ahead to keep some 20% of the country it has occupied.

"Ukraine did not know anything about it," Zelenskyy warned ahead of the meeting.

Kyiv "regards any negotiations on Ukraine without Ukraine as ones that have no result, and we cannot recognize ... any agreements about us without us," he said, adding that he planned to travel to Saudi Arabia on Wednesday for a trip had had been arranged in advance and was not related to the talks between the U.S. and Russia.

Danish Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen warned that Russia could use the pause to remobilize and mount a fresh attack on Ukraine or target other countries in Europe.

"Russia is threatening all of Europe now, unfortunately," Frederiksen said, reflecting the view of many in Europe that Putin would seek to dominate, if not outright occupy, more countries.

In Kherson, a port city in southern Ukraine that has come under heavy Russian shelling throughout the war, residents balanced their hopes for an end to the fighting with fears about Trump's decision to leave Kyiv out of negotiations.

"It's confusing. It's going quickly and we don't see where it's going," Yulia Ishuk, who worked at a restaurant in the port city of Odesa before the war and now runs a rehab center for soldiers, told an NBC News crew on the ground.

"Without our president, Zelenskyy ... its kind of like games behind our backs and we don't like it because we don't understand that," Ishuk, 47, said. "We don't understand what's going on."

As negotiators had discussions in Riyadh, Washington's special envoy for Ukraine and Russia, Keith Kellogg, was in Brussels on Tuesday, where he was was meeting with European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen ahead of a trip to Ukraine.

During his briefing in Abu Dhabi, Zelenskyy said he wanted to take Kellogg "to the front line" and have him meet with intelligence officials and diplomats so he could "bring more information back to America."

Kellogg's visit comes after France on Monday hosted an emergency meeting of European Union countries and Britain to decide how to respond after the Trump administration said they would not be part of the talks.

French President Emmanuel Macron said he spoke with both Trump and Zelenskyy following an emergency meeting of European leaders Monday.

"We seek a strong and lasting peace in Ukraine," Macron said in a post on X. "To achieve this, Russia must end its aggression, and this must be accompanied by strong and credible security guarantees for the Ukrainians."

Noting his conversation with Macron, Zelenskyy said in a post on X on Monday that the two world leaders shared a "common vision" of "robust and reliable" security guarantees for Ukrainians.

"Any other decision without such guarantees — such as a fragile ceasefire — would only serve as another deception by Russia and a prelude to a new Russian war against Ukraine or other European nations," he warned. (*NBC News*)

18 people injured after Delta plane landing at Toronto airport overturns



At least 18 people were injured Monday when a Delta Air Lines plane overturned upon landing at Toronto Pearson International Airport.

There were no fatalities and the injuries were relatively minor, officials said Monday evening.

Video posted on social media and broadcast from the airport showed a surreal scene — the plane flipped completely upside down as emergency workers evacuated passengers and attended to the crash site.

"We just landed. Our plane crashed. It's upside down," John Nelson, who recorded the video, said as he walked away from the plane. He said that "most people appear to be OK" and that passengers were getting off of the plane.

Toronto Pearson CEO Deborah Flint said that of those injured, none were in critical condition.

Earlier Monday, Lawrence Saindon, a superintendent for Peel Regional Paramedic Services, said 12 people were taken by ground for medical attention.

He said two others were were airlifted to a nearby trauma center.

One of those was reported to be a man in his 60s who was being taken to St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto, according to Joshua McNamara, corporate communications lead with Toronto Air Ambulance. The other was a woman in her 40s, who was being taken to Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre in Toronto.

Saindon also said an ambulance took a child to the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto.

The Federal Aviation Administration said in a statement that Delta Air Lines Flight 4819, which was operated by Endeavor Air and was arriving from Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport, crashed on landing in Toronto around 2:15 p.m. Endeavor is a "wholly owned subsidiary of Delta Air Lines headquartered in Minneapolis," Delta said.

Eighty people were on the plane, a CRJ-900, the FAA said. There were 76 passengers and four crew members on board, Delta said.

Flint said 22 passengers were Canadian and the rest were "multinational."

Toronto Pearson is under a ground delay "due to an aircraft emergency,"

according to the National Airspace System Status from the FAA, with an average delay of 292 minutes. An earlier ground stop was lifted when departures and arrivals from the airport resumed about 5 p.m., the airport said.

Delta has canceled all flights into and out of Toronto Pearson scheduled for Monday night and issued travel waivers to its customers, the airline said in a statement.

Snow was blowing at the Toronto airport all day. There was lake effect snow earlier in the day, but no snow was reported or on radars at the time of the accident.

At the time of the crash there were 20 to 30 mph winds, with reported gusts up to 40 mph.

As the passengers were being evacuated, the temperature was 18 degrees, with a windchill temperature of minus 2.

The Association of Flight Attendants union, which posted on social media that it was responding to the event, said some of its crew members were working on the flight.

The Transportation Safety Board of Canada will investigate, according to the FAA. The TSB confirmed on X that it is deploying a team to investigate.

The National Transportation Safety Board said it will assist the TSB of Canada with the investigation.

Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy said that FAA investigators are on their way to Toronto and that he has been in touch with his Canadian counterpart to help with the investigation.

"The hearts of the entire global Delta family are with those affected by today's incident at Toronto-Pearson International Airport,"said Ed Bastian, CEO of Delta. "I want to express my thanks to the many Delta and Endeavor team members and the first responders on site." (NBC News)



Internationa **Israel partially withdrawing troops** from Lebanon as deadline expires

Israel is pulling its forces out of southern Lebanon as the deadline for their withdrawal under a fragile ceasefire deal has passed.

The Israeli military continued a pullback on Tuesday morning for the second day. However, while the majority of its forces will meet the revised deadline agreed under the ceasefire deal with Hezbollah, Israel has said it will remain in five strategic locations, warning it is ready to resume hostilities.

Lebanon's army, which under the deal should deploy across the south of the country as Israeli forces vacate, reported on Tuesday morning that it was present in about a dozen villages and border areas.

Israeli military spokesperson Nadav Shoshani confirmed that five hilltop locations will be maintained to provide vantage points and protection for communities in northern Israel.

He claimed the "temporary measure" was approved by the United States-led body monitoring the ceasefire.

Lebanese President Joseph Aoun had raised concerns that a complete withdrawal would not be achieved by the deadline, saying "the Israeli enemy cannot be trusted".

On Tuesday, a spokesperson for his office said Lebanon would consider any remaining Israeli presence on its lands an occupation, and that Beirut has the right to use all means to ensure a full withdrawal.

Lebanon is also set to ask the United Nations Security Council to force Israel to comply fully with

the ceasefire agreement.

However, Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz confirmed that the five locations would be maintained to guard against any ceasefire violations by Hezbollah. He added that the army has erected new posts on the Israeli side of the border and sent reinforcements.

"We are determined to provide full security to every northern community," Katz said.

Hezbollah and Israel agreed on the ceasefire in November, following months of cross-border hostilities and war, as the Iran-linked Lebanese group reacted to Israel's war in Gaza with rocket attacks on northern Israel, which were reciprocated by fire from the Israeli side.

Israel then launched a ground

Ministry of Public Health.

Under the deal, brokered by the United States and France, Lebanon's military was to deploy in the south of the country alongside UN peacekeepers, as the Israeli army withdrew over a 60-day period.

Hezbollah was to pull back north of the Litani River, about 30km (18.6 miles) from the border, and dismantle its remaining military infrastructure there.

The initial deadline for the Israeli withdrawal in late January was extended to February 18.

However, on Monday, Israel's military announced that it would maintain the five locations along the border to "continue to defend our residents and to make sure there's no immediate threat". (Al Jazeera English)




