St. Paul makes history!

The constituency of St. Paul, long associated with the history of Antigua and Barbuda, is again making history; this time in another area of human development; the provision of healthcare services.

With the opening of the new Cobbs Cross Health centre on Monday afternoon, Health and Wellness Minister, Sir Molwyn Joseph, revealed that St. Paul has created history as the first area to have two new clinics opened in a single year. (The Liberta Clinic opened earlier in the year following extensive refurbishing and repairs).

Sir Molwyn noted that politics is based on candidates making promises to communities when they are seeking votes, but as a politician for almost forty years, the current ABLP Administration is the first that he is aware of that consistently delivers on its promises.

"While we all agree that education is an important facet of development, health has to be a top priority as without it the nature suffers. So health was made a priority by the prime minister, thus, when in the first year of my appointment as minister of health, I discovered that all the

keys diagnostic equipment – MRI, CT-Scan and Mammogram etc. – were all out of operation, it was the prime minister who asked the question; how much would it take to get these machines working again. He told me that he would make US\$10 million to purchase new equipment or to have those that were there repaired," Sir Molwyn revealed.

Additionally, the health minister further revealed that when he took up office, all twenty-three of the clinics were in some form of disrepair; meaning that they required extensive repairs or to be rebuilt totally.

Today, Sir Molwyn disclosed a total

of seventeen of the clinics have been repaired or rebuilt with only six of these facilities that require attention.

"The most important healthcare agency comprises the nation's clinics. If you have strong primary health care service that is well-developed, well-supported with both nurses and diagnostic equipment, you could reduce the burden of the tertiary health facility such as SLB-MC by at least twenty-percent. This would allow you to redirect the traffic away from SLBMC. So the idea why we are here today, is to ensure that we have a robust primary health care system," he explained.

Sir Molwyn announced plans to expand the services that are offered at both the Liberta and Cobbs Cross clinics to add equipment for testing of blood and even a CT Scan. "The idea is that everyone should not have to go at SLBMC for these types of diagnostic services," he stated.

According to Sir Molwyn the government intends to provide clinics that will provide sustainable services to the people of Antigua and Barbuda over the long term.

The people of Cobbs Cross and surrounding communities can at last breathe a sigh of relief as the long delayed health clinic has finally been officially opened and ready to serve the health-care needs of residents.

Before a packed audience that included Prime Minister Gaston Browne and several members of the Cabinet and the Senate, Member of Parliament for the Area, Foreign Affairs Minister E.P Chet Greene described the occasion as more than the symbolism of the 'ribbon-cutting'. Instead, he said, it represented a new chapter in the provision of health care in the community.

"We stand here as a testament to a simple yet powerful promise; a simple but powerful truth; Promise made, promise kept," he declared.

The representative recalled that the doors of the previous clinic were shut back in 2003 'in disgrace', adding that it was not a closure by choice, but one that was

forced upon the authorities when the conditions had deteriorated to the point where rodents literally chased the people who worked there away.

MP Greene described the time of the closure as 'a low point' as it was a symbol of the neglect that the health facility and the people of the community had experienced for 'far too long'.

"This however demanded leadership; it demanded a vision and I am happy that our prime minister is a visionary who joined me in working towards the realization of this project. So

from that disappointment, a seed of determination was planted. We made a vow that day to you the people; we will not rest until you had the health facility that you deserved. A facility that would not let you hang your head in shame, but to hold your head up in pride," he stated.

The opening of the clinic, Greene emphasized is the fulfilment of the vow and replacing the memory of decay with a modern new building state-of-the-art community health centre," he declared.

Greene called on the members of the community to see the facility as an investment for them, and he encouraged them to make the best of its services. "Take ownership of this facility, cherish and protect it as it stands as a monument to resilience and shared progress," he remarked.

He also announced plans to acquire neighbouring lands to erect a dental and eyecare clinic.





NSWMA announces the resumption of derelict vehicles removal and rodent baiting

The National Solid Waste Management Authority (NSWMA) is advising all citizens and residents that the Derelict Vehicle Removal Program will resume operations on October 13th 2025, under the National Clean-up and Beautification Initiative.

The Collaboration will have several agencies to include Antigua and Barbuda Defense Force (ABDF), Traffic Police, Central Board of Health (CBH), Ministry of Works, and Community Division.

Prior to the start date CBH will start baiting for rodents from Grid 1 which spans Dickenson Bay Street across to Fort Road down to Fort James. This program is part of its ongoing effort to maintain the safety, cleanliness, and aesthetic of all communities. Derelict or abandoned vehicles not only pose safety hazards but also detract from the visual appearance of the neighborhoods.

According to the Litter Control and Prevention Ac, No. 3 of 2019, Section 13 (1), it states that "Where any derelict vehicle is left in any public place in such circumstances as to cause, con-



tribute to or tend to the defacement of the environment by reason of the presence of such derelict vehicle, the local authority may give notice to the owner or last known owner of the derelict vehicle requiring him to remove the derelict vehicle from the public place within twenty-four hours of such notice."

What You Need to Know:


· Vehicles considered derelict may include those that are inoperable, unreg-

istered, abandoned on public property, or pose a public safety risk.

· Property owners are responsible for ensuring that any derelict vehicles on their property are removed or properly secured.

We encourage residents to report derelict vehicles by contacting the NSWMA at 562-2019 or Traffic Reserve at 764-2001.

The Social Security Debate: What are he facts



Prime Minister Gaston Browne, who is also the country's Finance Minister, has again returned to the highly political and divisive issue; the Social Security Debt controversy.

The matter came up for discussion last Saturday on the popular, *Browne and Browne* show on Point FM.

According to the prime minister several opposition figures, particularly Harold Lovell, had claimed that the UPP administration "never borrowed from Social Security." PM Browne immediately addressed the statement. "I never said they borrowed," he clarified. "But if you didn't pay your contributions, that's a form of borrowing. You're using funds that belonged to the people."

He then pulled up official records from the Director of Social Security to clarify the historical debt data. Displaying an Excel spreadsheet on the broadcast screen, Browne broke it down year by year.

In 2003, at the end of the Labour Party's previous term, the government owed EC\$366 million to the Antigua and Barbuda Social Security Board. During the UPP administration (2004–2013), that figure rose steadily:

- ► 2004–2009: Debt increased from EC\$366M to EC\$471M.
- ► 2010–2013: It climbed further to EC\$538M, an increase of EC\$172

million.

"They made one payment of about EC\$36 million in 2013," PM Browne said, "but apart from that, the debt kept growing."

He explained that arrears, by definition, are equivalent to borrowing: "If you owe Social Security and use that money elsewhere, you've borrowed it — plain and simple. They left office owing EC\$538 million."

Under his administration, PM Browne continued, the government began reducing and restructuring the debt while making regular payments:

"We've paid over EC\$208 million in cash to Social Security — twice what they (the UPP's) paid during their 10 years. Yes, we added some arrears ourselves — about EC\$87 million — but we're now clearing that entirely."

To further ensure stability, the prime minister shared details of a comprehensive refinancing proposal sent by the Ministry of Finance to the Social Security Board. The proposal — officially signed by Financial Secretary Rosanna Davis-Crump — outlines a 25-year debt consolidation plan designed to guarantee the long-term solvency of the system.

Key Components of the Proposal:

1. Consolidation of Liabilities

All existing obligations — including the 2010 bond, the 2022 Development Bank bond, and all outstanding contributions through 2025 — will be merged into a single 25-year bond worth EC\$437.8 million.

- a. Years 1–5: Interest-only payments at 3% (about EC\$1.1M monthly)
- b. Years 6–10: Interest-only payments at 5% (about EC\$1.8M monthly)
- c. Years 11–25: Principal plus interest payments

The government has requested that Social Security waive accrued pastdue interest, simplifying the debt and providing predictable cash flows.

2. Lump Sum Payment and Asset Assignment

The government will provide a cash injection of up to EC\$75 million within the first 12 months to strengthen Social Security's liquidity and support investment diversification.

Additionally, it will transfer valuable assets, including the Jolly Beach property, to bolster the institution's financial base.

3. Commitment to Timely Contributions

Browne reiterated that the government would make consistent and on-time contributions going forward, ensuring the sustainability of the fund without increasing contribution rates or the retirement age.

"This is about giving our pensioners and workers peace of mind," PM Browne said. "We want Social Security to be sustainable without burdening citizens."

He confirmed that technical teams from both entities are preparing a Memorandum of Agreement, with plans to implement the new structure by January 2026.

Strengthening Ties: A Farewell Tribute to the Chinese Ambassador in Antigua and Barbuda

he recalled, was the organisation of the official visit of the Prime Minister of Antigua and Barbuda to China — a milestone that showcased her commitment and meticulous coordination. "I really saw you at work," the Minister remarked, recognizing the ambassador's ability to make complex diplomatic initiatives come to life.

The ministry announced plans to hold a formal farewell ceremony in collaboration with the Office of the Prime Minister, underscoring the depth of appreciation shared across government institutions. "It's two ministries at once saying goodbye to you," the Minister said, reinforcing the ambassador's far-reaching impact.

Reflecting on her tenure, the Minister highlighted several significant achievements that embodied the strengthening of bilateral ties. The period saw an expansion of training opportunities for Antiguans and Barbudans, as well as the growth of

Chinese investments across multiple sectors. "I can't think of a sector in our national economy where your work has not been felt," he affirmed.

Through numerous joint projects and shared initiatives, she noted, the relationship had grown stronger and more meaningful. "It's always my mission," she said, "to foster more reliable partnerships between our two sides and to see more projects completed for

"Every country deserves the right to development, no matter its size, stage, or population. That principle is deeply in our genes."



Also joining Minister Greene in expressing heartfelt gratitude and best wishes to the departing diplomat, was the Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ambassador Dr. Clarence Pilgrim, who gave recognition to Ambassador Zhang for all that she had done

for and on behalf of the people of Antigua and Barbuda. In particular, he highlighted her efforts in making the Booby Alley Project become a reality, noting that this would be her lasting legacy to the people of Antigua and Barbuda.

"While we acknowledge Prime Minister Gaston Browne's recommitment to advancing the national mental health framework,




it is critical that those living with mental illnesses have access to lifesaving care and treatment.





ICE nabs convicted Caribbean child sex predators



The United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) says officers from its San Diego, California office have arrested two Caribbean nationals among four undocumented immigrants who are convicted child sex predators.

ICE said the immigrants, citizens from The Bahamas, Cuba, Mexico and Vietnam, were taken into custody following convictions for crimes against children, including sexual assault, molestation and rape.

Devin Richardson, a Bahamian, was convicted of sexual assault of minors and failed to register as a sex offender in California.

The immigration enforcement agency also said Walter Ramirez, a citizen of Cuba, was convicted of rape, drug-induced sexual assault of a minor, and domestic violence.


ICE said all four immigrants were arrested in the San Di-

ego area and remain in ICE custody pending removal proceedings to their respective homelands.

"Make no mistake: these are predators who targeted the most vulnerable members of our community – children," said Patrick Divver, field office director for ICE's Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) San Diego.

"Our officers will not allow dangerous criminals like these to hide in our neighbourhoods, especially a convicted sex offender who lived next to what appeared to be an in-home daycare and two blocks from an elementary school.

"By taking them into custody, ICE has removed an immediate threat to public safety and sent a clear message that child predators who are illegal aliens do not belong in our country," Divver added. (CMC)

Nine shot, five fatally, in Commodore in Linstead, gang conflict may be behind attack – Police



The police are reporting that a gang conflict may be behind Sunday night's brutal mass shooting in Commodore in Linstead, St Catherine, which left five people dead, including a four-year-old, and four others nursing gunshot wounds.

According to police reports, around 8:45 p.m., the victims were at a premises commonly referred to as 'Big Yard' playing games when armed men, dressed in police fatigues, entered the compound.

The men reportedly shouted "police!" before opening fire with

high-powered weapons, hitting all nine individuals.

Five of the victims were pronounced dead at hospital, while four others were admitted.

The deceased have been identified as 4-year-old Shannon Gordon, a student of the Rosemount Primary and Infant School and Orange Park, Charliemount, Linstead; Mario Sullivan, 42, of Rosemount district in Linstead; 19-year-old Jushane Edwards also of Rosemount district, Linstead; 39-year-old vendor Iysha Washington of Rosemont district,

Linstead; and 22-year-old security guard Famous Amos of Commodore district, Linstead.

Assistant Commissioner of Police in charge of Area 5, Christopher Phillips, who visited the crime scene, described the situation as deeply troubling.

"The men parading as law enforcement officers pose a worrying sign," said Phillips.

He confirmed that investigators are working around the clock to determine the motive behind the deadly attack.

"We have a team of top investigators working to put the pieces together to determine what triggered such an awful incident," he said, adding that so far, indications are that the incident is a continuation of gang conflict.

Sources at the scene described the killing of the four-year-old as particularly gruesome, noting that she received several gunshot wounds.

Police say the premises where the incident occurred is one they have had reason to visit on numerous occasions. (Jamaica Gleaner)

Wider Caribbean nations to convene in Jamaica for critical summit on marine protection

Government officials and experts technical from across the Wider Caribbean Region will convene in Kingston, Jamaica from October 13 to 16, 2025, for the Eighteenth Meeting of the Contracting Parties (COP18) to the Cartagena Convention. Hosted by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the biennial summit will address mounting environmental pressures on the Caribbean Sea and set the strategic direction for regional marine conservation efforts.

COP18 will incorporate sessions for the Conference of Parties to the Land-Based Sources of Marine Pollution (LBS) Protocol and the Specially Protected Areas and Wildlife (SPAW) Protocol. These meetings aim to strengthen regional collaboration in combating marine pollution, biodiversity loss, and the degradation of coastal ecosystems.

Christopher Corbin, Coordinator of UNEP's Cartagena Convention Secretariat, stressed the urgency of the summit, citing a range of escalating threats to the region's marine environment.



"The marine environment is facing unprecedented pressures from land-based pollution, the ever-increasing challenge of plastic waste, massive influxes of sargassum, the intensifying impact of warming seas and coral reef bleaching, sea level and coastal erosion, ocean acidification, habitat and species loss," Corbin stated. "COP18 will serve as a crucial platform for the Convention Contracting Parties to reaffirm their commitment and forge a coordinated path forward to further safeguard these vital ecosystems."

Key objectives of COP18 include reviewing the implementation of the 2023-2024 work plan, approving a strategic programme and budget for 2026-2027, and adopting resolutions emerging environmental issues. Delegates will consider proposals to advance the regional action plan for marine litter, enhance pollution control from land-based sources, expand the network of protected areas and wildlife, and improve ocean governance frameworks to support a resilient and sustainable blue economy.

"This COP is a critical call to action," Corbin added. "We have the science and frameworks, but now we must accelerate implementation. Our focus will be on translating regional commitments into more tangible national actions that protect our shared marine resources for future generations."

Expected outcomes from COP18 include a robust and adequately financed work plan for 2025–2026, potential adoption of new guidelines and action plans particularly for sargassum management and plastic pollution—and renewed political commitment to the Convention and its three Protocols on Oil Spills, SPAW, and Land-Based Sources of Pollution.

"These outcomes will have far-reaching implications for the sustainable development of the region," Corbin concluded, "directly impacting key sectors such as tourism, fisheries, and shipping, and contributing to the global agenda for the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 14: Life Below Water." 

Tropical Storm Priscilla strengthens in Pacific Ocean off the coast of Mexico



Tropical Storm Priscilla was strengthening slowly in the eastern Pacific Ocean and could bring heavy rain and gusty winds to coastal southwestern Mexico, the National Hurricane Center said Sunday.

The Miami-based center said Priscilla, with winds near 70 mph (110 kph), could become a hurricane late Sunday or on Monday. Its tropical storm-force winds extended as far

as 125 miles (205 kilometres) from its center.

The threshold for a hurricane is a storm with winds of at least 74 mph (120 kph).

Priscilla was located about 285 miles (460 kilometres) south-south-west of Cabo Corrientes or about 480 miles (770 kilometres) south-southeast of the southern tip of Baja California and was moving north-northwest at 2 mph (4 kph). Priscilla was forecast to generally move parallel to the coast in the coming days.

A tropical storm watch was issued for part of the coast of southwestern Mexico, from Punta San Telmo to Punta Mita, with tropical storm conditions possible in the area Sunday and Monday.

Rainfall of up to 6 inches (15 centimeters) was possible, and there was a danger of life-threatening surf and rip current conditions on the coast.

Another storm well off Mexico in the Pacific, Octave, became a hurricane Sunday with no landfall in the forecast and no coastal watches or warnings.

Its top winds were near 80 mph (130 kph), and the hurricane centre said it was expected to gradually weaken on Monday.

It was located about 1,025 miles (1,650 kilometres) west-southwest of Baja California's southern tip and was moving northeast at 3 mph (6 kph). (AP)

Texas mom who shot her 4 children, killing 2, faces murder charges, authorities say

A Texas mother who shot her four children over the weekend, killing two of them, faces murder charges, authorities said Sunday.

The 31-year-old mother is being charged with two counts of murder and two counts of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, Brazoria County Sheriff Bo Stallman told reporters. She is being held on a \$14 million bond.

Two of the children, ages 13 and 4, were fatally shot inside a vehicle Saturday. The other children, ages 8 and 9, are in "stable condition" after being flown by a medical



helicopter to a Houston-area hospital, Stallman said.

The children's mother called

911 to alert authorities after the shooting, Stallman said. Authorities recovered


a weapon at the scene, he added.

"It is impossible to make sense of a senseless tragedy like this, but we will do everything we can to seek justice for these children," Stallman said.

The mother is a resident of Montgomery County to the north of Houston, he said.

The shooting took place in Angleton, a city of about 19,500 and which serves as the county seat of Brazoria County.

It is located about 45 miles (70 kilometres) south of Houston. (AP)

French Prime Minister Sébastien Lecornu resigns after less than a month



France's Prime Minister Sébastien Lecornu has resigned, less than a day after his cabinet was unveiled.

"The conditions were not fulfilled for me to carry on as prime minister," Lecornu said on Monday morning, and criticised the unwillingness by political parties to reach compromises.

The Elysée palace made the announcement after Lecornu met President Emmanuel Macron for an hour on Monday morning.

The shock move comes only 26 days after Lecornu was appointed prime minister following the collapse of the previous government of François Bayrou.

Parties across the board in the National Assembly had fiercely criticised the composition of Lecornu's cabinet, which was largely unchanged from Bayrou's, and threatened to vote it down.

Several parties are clamouring for early elections and some are calling for Macron to go - although he has always said he will not stand down before his term ends in 2027.

"The only wise thing to do now is to hold elections," said Marine Le Pen of

the hard-right National Rally (RN).

"The joke's gone on long enough. French people are fed up. Macron has put the country in an extremely difficult position," she added.

The decision on how to proceed now rests with Macron, who must surely be asking himself how long this political charade can be allowed to go on.

He has three options. He can appoint another prime minister. He can once again dissolve the National Assembly. Or he can resign himself.

The last is the least likely, while the first would be his natural choice.

However, who now could he name to form a government? Lecornu – the ultimate Macron loyalist – was seen as his last resort, but now he too has failed.

He could appoint a Socialist, on the basis that the left deserves a go at government - but a Socialist administration would itself not take long to fall.

So the logic must surely be for option two: for new legislative elections.

The result would probably be a rout for the pro-Macron centre, and a big victory for the hard-right of Marine Le Pen. But when every other recourse fails, few avenues remain.

Various French media reported that Macron was not expected to make a statement on Monday, leaving questions swirling over what his next move to break the impasse will be.

Lecornu, a former armed forces minister, was France's fifth prime minister in under two years.

In his brief speech outside the Hôtel de Matignon, the prime minister's residence, which he only occupied for less than a month, Lecornu sharply criticised the "partisan appetites" of political factions, who he said "are all behaving as if they had an absolute majority".

"I was ready for compromise but all parties wanted the other party to adopt their programmes in their entirety," he said.

"It wouldn't need much for this to work," he added, saying, however, that parties needed to be more humble and "to cast some egos aside".

French politics has been highly unstable since July 2024, when Macron called for snap parliamentary elections in a bid to achieve a clear majority following a bruising loss for his party in the European Parliament vote.

Instead the elections resulted in a hung parliament divided into ideologically opposed factions deeply at odds with one another and unwilling to work together.

This has made it difficult for any prime minister to garner the necessary support to pass any bills.

Michel Barnier was appointed prime minister last September but was ousted within three months.

The government of his successor François Bayrou's too was voted down after nine months after parliament refused to back his austerity budget, which aimed to slash government spending by €44bn (\$51bn; £38bn).

France's deficit reached 5.8% of its GDP in 2024 and its national debt is 114% of its GDP. That is the third highest public debt in the eurozone after Greece and Italy, and equivalent to almost €50,000 per French citizen.

Stocks fell sharply on the Paris exchange after the news of Lecornu's resignation broke on Monday morning. (BBC)

African qualifiers to provide seven more World Cup finalists

CAPE TOWN (Reuters) - Africa's group qualifiers for the 2026 World Cup conclude over the next week, providing seven more finalists for the tournament in North America.

With two rounds of group matches still to be played, Morocco and Tunisia are already guaranteed top place in their respective groups, while the identity of the seven other group winners – all of whom will earn an automatic place at the 2026 finals – will be finalised by next Tuesday.

Egypt are expected to secure their berth on Wednesday when they take on lowly Djibouti in Group A, while Ghana will win Group I on the same day if they beat the Central African Republic away from home and closest rivals Madagascar falter at the same time.

Algeria need a point from their penultimate Group G clash against Somalia on Thursday to add their name to the list.

In Group D, the tiny Cape Verde Islands have a four-point lead over second-placed Cameroon and therefore need to win one of their last two qualifiers to snatch a fairytale berth at the finals.

Cape Verde are away to Libya on Thursday and finish their campaign at home

to Eswatini next Monday.

Senegal are handily placed in Group B with a two-point lead over the Democratic Republic of Congo and qualify if they win their last two matches, away against South Sudan on Friday and then home to Mauritania next Tuesday.

It is also clear what the Ivory Coast need to do in Group F to keep up their one-point advantage over Gabon. They will qualify if they win away to the low-ly-ranked Seychelles on Friday and then at home to Kenya on October 14.

In Group C, South Africa had a three-point lead but

points were stripped last week for fielding a defaulter in March, leaving them now trailing Benin on goal difference.

Benin, however, play their last two qualifiers away to Rwanda on Friday and Nigeria next Tuesday while South Africa are at home to Zimbabwe on Friday and Rwanda next Tuesday.

The clash against neighbours Zimbabwe is formally an away game but because they do not have a stadium that has been deemed suitable for use in international competition, Zimbabwe have elected to take the fixture to Durban, handing South Africa a

major advantage.

At the weekend, their Belgian coach Hugo Broos took responsibility for the bungle that saw South Africa field midfielder Teboho Mokoena when he should have been suspended.

"I am responsible. I am the coach, I had to know that this guy had two yellow cards. So, stop with it," he said of the ongoing outrage from South African fans.

"Just focus on the two games remaining now and support us. We will do everything to win these games, and for me, it's an extra motivation."

South Africa begin WTC title defence with target on their back

PRETORIA (Reuters) - South Africa captain Aiden Markram says his side can expect to have a target on their back when they begin a new cycle of the World Test Championship as defending champions.

South Africa play a two-Test series in Pakistan, starting on Sunday, and two games in India in November as they bid to retain the trophy they won in June by beating Australia by five wickets at Lord's.

The World Test Championship is decided at the end of a two-year cycle, with the top two teams competing in a one-off five-day match.

"I suppose you create a bit of a tar-

get on your back if you've won (the WTC), and if that's the case, it's fair. We want to chase a place in the final again and lift that trophy once again but realise each team will be coming for us," said Markram, who stands in as skipper for Temba Bavuma who has been ruled out of the tour with a calf

"We, as a team, have to keep getting better and improving and playing well in all different types of conditions. It starts for us in Pakistan, and it's a challenge the boys will be up for," he told a press conference on Monday.

South Africa have been practising on specially prepared spinning wickets at

Pretoria's High Performance Centre.

"There were a couple of nets prepared where the spin is really exaggerated, and you'd rather err on that side, and maybe then it's a bit easier when we get to Pakistan," Markram said.

"We're expecting to face a lot of spin over there, and it's also, naturally, a lot lower there from a seam point of view. There's a lot of skiddy, so it's hard to try and emulate that here in South Africa, but we've been looking to put a lot of emphasis on finding a way to train for that."

The first Test against Pakistan is in Lahore and the second begins on October 20 in Rawalpindi.
