Government to upgrade Border Control System

The government has approved a major upgrade to the Department of Immigration's Border Management System (BMS) and e-Visa platform, marking a significant step forward in strengthening border security, improving efficiency at ports of entry, and enhancing the overall travel experience.

The upgrade will modernise systems that have been in operation for more than a decade and have reached the end of their functional lifespan. The new platform will introduce advanced technology designed to support the country's growing travel and tourism sector while ensuring alignment with evolving international security and aviation standards.

Key features of the upgraded system include enhanced passenger screening capabilities, automated processing of passenger in-



formation, and seamless integration across air and sea ports. The upgrade will also expand coverage to include Barbuda and introduce electronic gates (e-Gates) to facilitate faster and more efficient passenger movement.

The new system will strengthen security through improved biometric and watchlist functionality, expanded fingerprint databases, and upgraded reporting tools. It will also integrate with international law en-

forcement and aviation platforms, supporting compliance with International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) standards and future developments such as next-generation e-Passports.

In addition, the project includes a comprehensive upgrade of hardware and software, migration of existing data to the new platform, and the expansion of infrastructure across multiple ports of entry. Ongoing

maintenance, technical support, and the involvement of local service providers will ensure the long-term sustainability and resilience of the system.

The Cabinet believes that failure to modernise the existing infrastructure would risk operational delays at ports of entry, increased security vulnerabilities, and potential negative impacts on tourism and border control operations. The upgrade is therefore considered both timely and essential.

The Ministry of Information, Communication Technologies, Utilities and Energy emphasized that the modernised system will significantly enhance national security, improve service delivery, and position Antigua and Barbuda to meet future border management and travel facilitation demands.



Research shows that the decision not to have a hard lockdown during COVID-19 pandemic benefited Antigua and Barbuda

Prime Minister Gaston Browne says research now shows that the decision not to enforce a 'hard' lockdown of the Antigua and Barbuda economy during the COVID-19 pandemic

was beneficial to the country.

PM Browne says despite skepticism from some quarters Antigua and Barbuda was the last Caribbean territory to lockdown because

of the COVID-19 pandemic and the first to open. The prime minister, who is also the country's finance minister, revealed that comparatively, Antigua and Barbuda did much better than neighbouring St. Kitts and Nevis, which followed conventional wisdom with a hard lockdown.

"We took a decision not to lockdown our economy. We allowed Global Ports Holding and other major capital projects to continue to the extent that they contributed to economic development during those slow years, the COVID years. Additionally, they kept a number of people employed during the period," the prime minister recalled.

According to PM Browne the research was undertaken by the government into the decision to continue to 'do business' with what he

termed 'a soft lockdown'. "We were the last to lockdown and the first to open in the Caribbean and when we compared the economic gains that we had during that period compared Kitts and Nevis, there was a net gain in the region of \$1 billion in economic activity as a result of the decision we took to pursue a **high-risk profile** to allow our economy to continue to function," he revealed.

In fact, he emphasized, if the government had pursued a hard lockdown similar to the ones implemented by other economies in the region, Antigua and Barbuda would still be suffering from the scars associated with the lockdown.

"Though it was considered to be somewhat risky, it was the right decision that we took at the time," he further emphasized.

Hezekiah Parker Jr. to serve 2-years 7-months in prison

Hezekiah Parker Jr. of Cedar Valley Heights has been sentenced to prison, following his conviction for firearm and ammunition-related offences.

The defendant appeared before Chief Magistrate Ngaio Emanuel at the St. John's Magistrate's Court on Tuesday, where he entered pleas to multiple charges arising from his arrest.

Parker Jr. pleaded guilty to Possession of an Unlicensed Firearm, Possession of Ammunition, and Possession of Cannabis. He pleaded not guilty to Possession of Cannabis with Intent to Supply.

The pleas were accepted by the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP), and the charge of possession

with intent to supply was subsequently withdrawn.

On the charge of Possession of an Unlicensed Firearm, involving one Smith & Wesson .380 pistol, Parker Jr. was sentenced to two (2) years and seven (7) months at His Majesty's Prison.

For Possession of Ammunition, involving seven .380 rounds of ammunition, he was sentenced to six (6) months imprisonment. He was reprimanded and discharged on the charge of Possession of Cannabis, involving 100 grams of cannabis.

The court ordered that all sentences run concurrently.

One man is in police custody charged with aggravated robbery



Police have arrested one man who is assisting with investigations into an alleged aggravated robbery that occurred in the Gunthorpes area on Monday, 26 January.

Reports indicate that around 8:00 a.m., two male suspects allegedly entered a business establishment and used a

knife to rob the proprietor of a knapsack containing cash and other personal documents.

The suspects reportedly fled the area, and the stolen bag was later recovered.

On Tuesday, 27 January, police executed several search warrants at multiple locations in St. John's as part of the ongoing investigation.

One man was subsequently arrested on suspicion of aggravated robbery and taken into custody.

Investigations are ongoing.



Six Months. One App. Thousands of Chances to Build Access

Diana does not want to lose her independence. At Potter's Primary School, she can use the bathroom on her own. She can access her classroom without assistance. These changes may appear small, but for a child with a disability, they are life-changing. In September, when Diana moves to secondary school, that independence is under threat.

Sir Novelle Richards Academy, the school closest to her home, does not have an accessible bathroom. Antigua Girls' High School, where Diana hopes to attend if she places in the top 100, is also not accessible. St. Mary's Secondary School has an accessible bathroom, but requires a lift to reach upper floors and transportation support. This is not a lack of ambition. It is a lack of infrastructure.

"When I met Diana in Grade 4, she had to ask for help every time she needed to use the restroom," said Joshuanette Francis of Good Humans 268 Inc. "That is not independence. I will not allow her to go backwards." Diana's story represents a larger issue affecting thousands. Roughly 16,000 people in Antigua and Barbuda live with disabilities, yet many secondary schools remain inaccessible. Children grow — but access often does not grow with them.

Through Project RED, Good Humans 268 is working to change that by retrofitting at least 10 schools across the island. This year, a new partner has made it easier for the public to be part of the solution: AllMart. For the next six months, anyone making a purchase on the AllMart App will have the option to donate toward accessibility at check-out. No separate fundraiser. No special event. Just a simple choice made during everyday shopping. "Accessibility should be everyone's responsibility," Francis said. "The AllMart App allows people to support the mission in a practical, consistent way."

Donations made through the app will

support accessibility upgrades at secondary schools, including lifts, bathrooms, and transportation solutions. Early assessments have been completed at Sir Novelle Richards Academy, Antigua Girls' High School, and St. Mary's Secondary School. While St. Mary's is currently the most cost-effective immediate option, all three schools remain part of the organization's long-term plan. A full cost comparison will be shared publicly in the coming weeks. Accessibility is not a one-time fix. Once built, it remains — supporting future students, teachers, and families.

For the next six months, every pur-

chase on the AllMart App is a chance to help build access. Good Humans 268 is encouraging the public to donate what they can, share the mission, and stay locked on their social media platforms for updates, videos, and more information as this year's accessibility work unfolds.

Because dignity should not depend on which school a child attends — and access should be built into the system, one step at a time.

Jamaica has lost a musical titan, Gov't and Opposition remember Sly Dunbar



The Government and the Opposition have hailed veteran drummer and musician Lowell 'Sly' Dunbar as an extraordinary and influential figure in Jamaican music who contributed significantly to the musical landscape.

Dunbar passed away this morning after a period of illness.

In paying tribute, Prime Minister Dr Andrew Holness said Jamaica has lost a titan of music.

"Sly was an architect of sound. Alongside Robbie Shakespeare, he established a foundation that defined the era of reggae and dancehall. From the 'Taxi' label to his work with international superstars like Grace Jones and the Rolling Stones, Sly's influence was global," said Holness in a post on his social media.

The Prime Minister described Dunbar as a pioneer who integrated electronic elements into traditional reggae beats, thus keeping the music modern and relevant for decades.

Dunbar remained humble, he noted, despite international recognition and the Order of Distinction award.

"His contribution to our cultural heri-

tage is immeasurable. His legacy lives on every time a drum kit is played or a reggae record spins. On behalf of the Government and people of Jamaica, I extend my heartfelt condolences to his family, friends, and the music fraternity," continued the Prime Minister.

Meanwhile, Minister of Culture Olivia 'Babsy' Grange described Dunbar as one of the greatest drummers ever, saying his passing is a great loss for reggae music.

"Sly and Robbie produced some of the best Jamaican music; they appeared on many records and backed some of our most outstanding artistes, including Bunny Wailer, Black Uhuru, Jimmy Cliff, Beenie Man, Chaka Demus and Pliers, Grace Jones, and Omi, among others," said Grange in a statement on Monday.

"Sly and Robbie were the 'go-to'. They produced and/or played on tracks for several international acts, including No Doubt, Bob Dylan, the Rolling Stones, the Fugees, and Simply Red. Sly was a truly gifted and remarkable musician and producer," said Grange, as she sent condolences to his family.

Meanwhile, the Opposition People's

National Party, through its Spokesperson on Culture, Nekeisha Burchell, described Dunbar as a world-class musician and a creative force in the exportation of Jamaica's culture worldwide.

"Sly Dunbar was rhythm, innovation, and excellence in motion. He represented the very best of Jamaican creativity—bold, original, and uncompromising in its quality. His contribution to our music industry helped position Jamaica as a cultural superpower long before the term became fashionable," Burchell said.

Through his work, Burchell said Dunbar influenced countless artistes across genres and generations, and opened doors for Jamaican musicians, producers, and creatives to access global markets and collaborations.

"His legacy goes beyond awards, living in the sound of Jamaican music. That legacy places a responsibility on us to protect, invest in, and grow the creative industries that icons like Sly helped to build," she said, while also extending condolences to Dunbar's family. (Jamaica Gleaner)

the meeting after the nomination was made.


Azruddin Mohamed, along with his father Nazar Mohamed have been indicted on several charges in the United States and are now facing extradition proceedings.

Migrant registration website sees over 137,000 hits in first day



By 1 p.m. on Monday, the Government's Migrant Registration Framework had received 137,198 hits to its website.

According to Homeland Security Minister Roger Alexander, the online programme was launched at 12 a.m. on Monday morning.

By 1 p.m. the website had registered 137,198 hits, Alexander stated via What's App.

Information provided by Alexander stated that as of 1 p.m., 1,611 persons started applications but did not complete the process.

The number of completed applications was at 599, he advised.

The Government earlier this month announced its continuation, with some changes, of the previous administration's migrant registration process for Venezuelans.

The renewed MRF was expanded to include all migrants in Trinidad and Tobago.

Alexander also last week announced that applicants would be subject to a fee of \$700.

The processing charge was criticised by some civil rights activists, including Venezuelan activist Yesenia Gonzales, who argued that most migrants would be unable to come up with the money.


Gonzales was also among those claiming that the registration was being unjustly used to net and deport Venezuelans, which has been denied by Alexander. (Trinidad Express)

US President Trump pulls immigration chief out of Minnesota after second fatal ICE shooting



The Trump administration has announced that they are conducting a comprehensive review of the recent incidents involving law enforcement, following the death of a U.S. citizen in a second fatal shooting by federal agents within a few weeks.

The incident occurred on Saturday in Minneapolis, where federal agents shot and killed Pretti.

The details surrounding this latest incident have sparked intense debate, highlighting ongoing tensions between state and federal authorities, stated the BBC.

Officials have supported the actions of the officers involved, with Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem asserting that the individual, Alex Jeffrey Pretti, an intensive-care nurse, was shot because he was allegedly “brandishing” a firearm.

However, local officials dispute this account, stating that the weapon was legally registered and that Pretti was shot after the firearm was taken away from him.

Pretti’s family has clarified that he owned a handgun legally and had a permit to carry concealed in Minnesota, though they stated they were unaware he was carrying it at the time. Law enforcement sources in the area confirm that Pretti was a licensed firearm owner, and that Minnesota law permits carrying a handgun in public with proper authorization.

The BBC reports that the video shows a physical altercation between Border Patrol agents and Pretti moments before the shooting took place.

The Department of Homeland Security maintains that the agents acted in self-defense, claiming Pretti was resisting their efforts to disarm him and

that he was armed with a handgun at the time.

Meanwhile, a headline from the New York Times said:

The article goes on to outline that videos analyzed by The New York Times appear to contradict federal accounts of the shooting.

“Federal officials said he was armed, but there is no sign in videos analyzed by The New York Times that he pulled his weapon, or that agents even knew he had one until he was already pinned on the sidewalk.”

In response, President Donald Trump announced earlier that his administration was conducting a comprehensive review following the deadly shooting.

“President Donald Trump indicated today there may be a shift in how his administration will handle its immigration crackdown in Minnesota following a call with Gov. Tim Walz today.

“It was a very good call, and we, actually, seemed to be on a similar wavelength,” Trump wrote Truth Social,” as reported by CNN.

The White House has since announced that Customs and Border Patrol Chief will be shipped out of the state of Minnesota tomorrow and replaced with colleague Tom Homan.

US braces for more freezing cold as winter storm leaves at least 29 dead

Many in the United States faced another night of below-freezing temperatures and no electricity after a colossal winter storm heaped more snow Monday on the Northeast and kept parts of the South coated in ice.

At least 29 deaths were reported in states afflicted with severe cold.

Deep snow — over a foot (30 centimetres) extending in a 1,300-mile (2,100-kilometre) swath from Arkansas to New England — halted traffic, canceled flights and triggered wide school closures Monday.

The National Weather Service said areas north of Pittsburgh got up to 20 inches (50 centimetres) of snow and faced wind chills as low as minus 25 degrees Fahrenheit (minus 31 degrees Celsius) late Monday into Tuesday.

The bitter cold afflicting two-thirds of the US wasn't going away. The weather service said Monday that a fresh influx of arctic air is expected to sustain freezing temperatures in places already covered in snow and ice. And forecasters said it's possible another winter storm could hit parts of the East Coast this weekend.

A rising death toll included two people run over by snowplows in Massachusetts and Ohio, fatal sledding accidents in Arkansas and Texas, and a woman whose body was found covered in snow by police with bloodhounds after she was last seen leaving a Kansas bar.

In New York City, officials said eight people were found dead outdoors in the course of the frigid weekend.

There were still more than 670,000 power outages in the nation Monday evening, according to poweroutage.com. Most of them were in the South, where weekend blasts of freezing rain caused tree limbs and power lines to snap, inflicting crippling outages on northern Mississippi and parts of Tennessee. (AP)

India and EU announce 'mother of all trade deals'



The European Union and India have announced a landmark trade deal after nearly two decades of on-off talks, as both sides aim to deepen ties amid tensions with the US.

“We did it, we delivered the mother of all deals,” European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said at a media briefing in Delhi. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi called the pact “historic”.

It will allow free trade of goods between the bloc of 27 European states and the world’s most populous country, which together make up nearly 25% of global gross domestic product and a market of two billion people.

The deal will see a number of huge tariff cuts across a range of goods and services, and a joint security partnership.

Von der Leyen and European Council President António Costa are in Delhi, where they met Modi at a bilateral summit.

The European Commission said would eliminate tariffs on most exports of chemicals, machinery and electrical equipment, as well as aircraft and spacecraft, following phased reductions. Significantly, duties on motor vehicles, currently as high as 110%, would be cut to 10% under a quota of 250,000 vehicles. That is six times larger than the 37,000-unit quota India granted to the UK in a deal signed last July.

India will also cut tariffs on wine, beer and olive oil from the EU. Brussels said the agreement would support investment flows, improve access to European markets and deepen supply-chain integration.

Delhi said almost all of its exports would get “preferential access” into the EU, with textiles, leather, marine products, handicrafts, gems and jewellery set to see a reduction or elimination of tariffs.

While commodities such as tea, cof-

fee, spices and processed foods will benefit from the agreement, Delhi “has prudently safeguarded sensitive sectors, including dairy, cereals, poultry, soy meal, certain fruits and vegetables, balancing export growth with domestic priorities”, it said.

Delhi and Brussels have also agreed on a mobility framework that eases restrictions for professionals to travel between India and the EU in the short term.

“This is India’s biggest free trade agreement,” Modi said. “It will make access to European markets easier for India’s farmers and small business. It will also boost manufacturing and services sectors. It will boost innovative partnerships.”

The trade deal comes as both India and the EU contend with economic and geopolitical pressure from the US.

Delhi is grappling with 50% tariffs imposed by President Donald Trump last year amid talks aimed at securing

a trade deal between India and the US that are still dragging on.

Last week, Trump threatened to escalate his trade war with European allies for opposing a US takeover of Greenland, before backing off.

That larger geopolitical context was evident in statements made by leaders.

On Tuesday, von der Leyen said: "This is the tale of two giants - the world's second and fourth largest economies. Two giants which chose partnership in a true win-win fashion. A strong message that co-operation is the best answer to global challenges."

A day before that Costa had said, without naming the US, that the trade deal would send an "important political message to the world that India and the EU believe more in trade agreements than in tariffs".

The deal with the European Union may help labour-intensive sectors in India such as shrimp farming, textiles, gems and jewellery, which were hit hard by the US tariffs, experts say.

But some analysts also predict challenges - especially when it comes to compliance with EU regulations and standards. "The EU has very strict regulations, for instance, on environment. It is one of the leaders when it comes to carbon offsetting mechanisms," says economist Mitali Nikore.

She says India's manufacturing sector "might not be fully prepared" for this and that it is critical that it takes steps to fix this.

"It is an opportunity more than a challenge," she says.

For the EU, the deal is aimed at providing some certainty, even security, in a time of economic coercion and global turbulence.

Germany and France are projected to be among the biggest beneficiaries even if this isn't the "super maximally ambitious" version of a trade deal once envisioned, says Andrew Small, Asia director at the European Council on Foreign Relations.

However, he says, the agreement is seen as a building block rather than a final destination as the EU looks to tap into a massive, fast-growing economy.

"It really is understood as a floor for what is possible for the bilateral relationship."

The formal signing is likely to take place only later this year, after the agreement is approved by the European Parliament and member states.

There may be some concerns around this after another major trade deal the EU struck with the Mercosur bloc of South American countries was recently derailed in the European Parliament.

However, the India agreement is regarded as less contentious as it "cuts around sensitives on both sides," says Small.

Alongside the trade agreement, India and the European Union are also advancing separate talks on security and defence co-operation, and climate ac-

tion.

On Tuesday, India's Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said he had discussed a range of bilateral security and defence issues with the European Commission's vice-president Kaja Kallas, including opportunities to integrate supply chains to build trusted defence ecosystems and develop future-ready capabilities.

The two sides are working on a draft security and defence partnership covering areas such as maritime security, cyber threats and defence dialogue, Reuters news agency reported.

The EU is India's largest trading partner in goods, with bilateral merchandise trade reaching \$136bn (£99.4bn) in 2024-25, nearly doubling over a decade.

Talks for a deal started in 2007 but stalled in 2013 over roadblocks in market access and regulatory demands. Discussions were formally restarted in July 2022.

Trump's tariffs proved to be a "useful tailwind in the homestretch" to get the deal over the line, one EU diplomat told the BBC.

In the past seven months, India has signed major trade agreements with the UK, Oman and New Zealand, and a 2024 pact signed with the four-nation European Free Trade Association bloc of Switzerland, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein came into effect last year. It signed a trade pact with Australia in 2022. (BBC)

Gauff dumped out by Svitolina at Australian Open

MELBOURNE (Reuters) - Coco Gauff's bid for a third Grand Slam title went up in smoke at the Australian Open quarter-finals with a 6-1, 6-2 defeat by Ukrainian Elina Svitolina on Tuesday, after the third seed endured a nightmare on serve.

The result meant 12th seed Svitolina marched into the semi-finals at Melbourne Park for the first time in her career, after three previous quarter-final finishes, keeping alive the 31-year-old's hopes of a maiden major title.

Svitolina will also return to the top 10 in the world when the updated rankings are released next Monday, a reward for her consistency after giving birth to her daughter with fellow tennis player Gael Monfils in late 2022.

Meanwhile, Carlos Alcaraz sizzled under the bright lights at the Australian Open and blazed into the men's singles semi-finals on Tuesday after

fellow women's top seed Aryna Sabalenka remained cool in the unforgiving Melbourne heat to stay on course for another title.

Alexander Zverev was briefly made to sweat under the roof of Rod Laver Arena before overcoming Learner Tien. The German third seed, runner-up to Jannik Sinner last year, secured a 6-3, 6-7(5), 6-1, 7-6(3) victory to stay on course for a first Grand Slam trophy but the path will get tougher with Alcaraz up next.

Alcaraz pulled off a dominant 7-5, 6-2, 6-1 victory over Alex de Minaur on the main showcourt, as the Spaniard dashed his sixth-seeded opponent's hopes of ending a five-decade Australian wait for a homegrown men's champion.

The 22-year-old, a six-times major winner, is seeking his own piece of history at Melbourne Park, where he

can eclipse Don Budge and become the youngest man to lift all four Grand Slam trophies.

Sabalenka, chasing her third title in four years, also got into a high gear for a dominant 6-3, 6-0 win over 18-year-old Iva Jovic on a sweltering Centre Court, where the roof was open with the "Heat Stress Scale" not at its highest threshold.

Shortly after her victory, though, tournament organisers invoked the extreme heat policy as temperatures crossed the 40 Celsius (104F) mark, prompting the suspension of play on the outer courts and the closure of roofs on the main ones.

Up next for Sabalenka is Ukrainian 12th seed Svitolina, who took full advantage of Gauff's woes on serve and reached her first Australian Open semi-final with her dominant victory in under an hour.

South Africa beat West Indies in first T20I

Captain Aiden Markram scored an unbeaten 86 to lead South Africa to a commanding nine-wicket victory in the opening KFC T20 International (T20I) against the West Indies at Boland Park in Paarl on Tuesday evening.

The right-handed opening barely put a foot wrong during his 47-ball innings, which included nine fours and three sixes, as he guided South Africa to victory at 176 for one with 13 balls to spare in response to the West Indies' 173 for seven after winning the toss and electing to bowl first.

Having scored a previous career-best of 78 against the West Indies in Grenada back in 2021, Markram drove Jason Holder down the ground for six to surpass that and then pulled the next ball for four to clinch victory.

Markram's opening stand of 83 with Lhuan-dre Pretorius, who hit 44, came from just 49 deliveries,

setting the perfect platform for the chase of the above-par target.

Pretorius was aggressive as normal, striking six fours and a six from 28 deliveries before being caught by Matthew Forde on the mid-wicket fence from the bowling of Roston Chase, who captured one for 31.

Markram had been given a life by Akeal Hosein at mid-off from the bowling of Holder when on 27, but the South African skipper calmed down and played the near-perfect innings.

Despite the loss of Pretorius's wicket, Markram was assisted perfectly by Ryan Rickelton. Rickelton cracked two sixes and a four from 32 deliveries, to end unbeaten on 40 as he and Markram shared an unbroken 93-run second-wicket partnership from only 62 balls.

Such was Markram's control that he only conceded eight dot balls with a strike-rate of 182.98.

Earlier, Shimron Hetmyer with

48 and Rovman Powell with 29 not out combined for an excellent sixth-wicket stand of 74 from 52 deliveries to guide the West Indies to their above-par total after the visitors found themselves in some difficulty at 95 for five in the 12th over.

The West Indies had made a fast start as Brandon King (27) and Johnson Charles (13) added 39 runs briskly for the opening stand from just 24 balls before Keshav Maharaj, who captured two for 44, found a gap in Charles' defences and castled the middle stump.

Then the visitors started chopping the ball onto their own stumps. King, after striking five fours and a six from 16 balls, chopped a ball from Corbin Bosch onto his stumps before Sherfane Rutherford (6) did the same against Maharaj.

Chase (22) repeated the feat against George Linde after Forde (16) had given his wicket away, well-caught by Kagiso Rabada diving forward at long-on from the bowling of Bosch, who finished with two for 35. Linde captured three for 25.

Hetmyer and Powell, who hit two fours and a six during his 25-ball knock, gave the West Indies a total worth defending under the Paarl night sky.

Chasing is never easy in the Cape Winelands but Hetmyer, who struck four fours and three maximums from 32 balls, had given the visitors a chance, but did not expect the dominant performance from Markram, Pretorius, and Rickelton.

Both teams will meet again in the second T20 International at SuperSport Park in Centurion on Thursday.

Division One teams select 16 players during ABBA Draft Showcase
